- The Road from Northampton by Knockbrack, Norman's Well, Nabawah Pool, and Narra Tarra, to Mr. M. Morrissey's, towards Nabagee. Hunt's line.
- 4. The Road from Northampton to the Geraldine Mines, viâ Stone Hut Station and Desert Spring.
- 5. The Road from the Desert Spring Well to Port Gregory, by Mr. Nancarrow's Farm and Lynton.
