IT is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency The Governor has received a Despatch from Her Majesty's Secretary of State for the Colonies, informing him that Her Majesty will not be advised to exercise her power of disallowance with respect to the following Acts passed during the last Session of the Legislative Council of Western Australia:—

- No. 1.—“An Act to regulate Grants of Patents for Inventions in the Colony of Western Australia.”
- No. 2.—“An Act to confirm the Expenditure for the services of the year One thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, beyond the grant for that year.”
- No. 3.—“An Act for raising the sum of Thirty-five Thousand Pounds by Loan for the construction of certain Public Works.”
- No. 4.—“An Act to repeal an Act for imposing Duties on imported Goods, and for exemption of certain Goods from Duties; and to make other provisions in lieu thereof.”
- No. 5.—“An Act to Consolidate and Amend the Laws relating to the Licensing of Public Houses and the Sale of Fermented and Spirituous Liquors.”
- No. 6.—“An Act to amend the “Scab-in-Sheep Ordinance, 1866,” and to Repeal the “Scab-in-Sheep Ordinance Amendment Act, 1871.”
- No. 7.—“An Act to Secure in Certain Cases the Right of Property in Telegraphic Messages.”
- No. 8.—“An Act to prevent the Unauthorised Occupation of Waste Lands of the Crown.”
- No. 9.—“An Act to consolidate and amend the Laws relating to Trespasses by Live Stock and to promote the construction of Fences.”

- No. 10.—“An Act to enable the Municipal Council of Geraldton to compel the Owners and Occupiers of Sand-hill Allotments to Plant the same with Grass or Shrubs.”
- No. 11.—“An Act to appropriate the sum of One Hundred and Four Thousand and Sixty-two Pounds Four Shillings and Tenpence out of the General Revenue of the Colony for the Service of the year One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three.”

2. The Road from Kobijawanna by Knockanena farm, the Wheel Fortune Mine, to Port Gregory.
3. The Road from Northampton by Knockbrack, Norman's Well, Nabawah Pool, and Narra Tarra, to Mr. M. Morrissey's, towards Nabagee. Hunt's line.

5. The Road from the Desert Spring Well to Port Gregory, by Mr. Nancarrow's Farm and Lynton.

LIGHTS IN THE SOUTH CHANNEL.

NOTICE is hereby given that on or about the 1st of May next it is intended to exhibit two (2) fixed leading lights for the purpose of facilitating the navigation of the South Channel.

The *Eastern light*, which will be a fixed fourth class dioptric light, will be shown immediately under Arthur's Seat from a height of eighty (80) feet above high-water level, and will be visible about fourteen (14) miles.

The *Western light* will also be a fixed fourth class dioptric light, placed at No. 10 buoy in the South Channel, and shown from a height of twenty-seven (27) feet above high-water level. It will be visible about ten (10) miles.

The lights will be cut to guide vessels clear of the "Middle Ground," of which further particulars, as well as sailing directions, will be published.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

VOLCANIC ISLAND, LAT. 20deg. 33min. N. LON.
144deg. 49min. E.

CAPTAIN ALMOND, F. R. A. S., of the British barque "Decapolis," reports the existence of a Volcanic Island in latitude 20deg. 33min. north, lon. 144deg. 49min. east.

The Island (? Guy Rock) is estimated to be from three to four miles in circumference and 900 feet high. It is of a conical shape, and was in active eruption on the 11th of July, 1872; a quantity of ashes was blown on board the "Decapolis" as she passed about 3 miles to leeward of it.

SUPPOSED ERROR IN POSITION OF THE
OCEAN ISLANDS.

THE "Decapolis" on her passage from Yokohama to Sydney, on the 20th of September, 1872, passed to the eastward of a dangerous group of Islands, the southernmost of which, from reliable observations, was found to be in lat. 9deg. 0min. north, lon. 165deg. 47min. east. This group extends N.N.W. and S.S.E. about 30 miles, and appears to be somewhat similar to the description of the Ocean Islands, although found to be situated considerably to the westward of the position given to those Islands on the chart.

NEREUS SHOAL.

CAPTAIN ALMOND also reports sighting the doubtful Nereus Shoal, and considers it to be near the position assigned to it on the chart.
