WARRANT

By His Excellency FREDERICK ALOYSIUS WELD, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the 68th Section of an Ordinance passed in the 24th Year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Ordinance to amend the Laws of the Customs in "Western Australia," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of his Executive Council, by his Warrant from time to time to appoint Ports in the said Colony which shall be Warehousing Ports: Be it therefore known unto all men that I, the Governor aforesaid, have, with the advice of my Executive Council, appointed and do hereby appoint the Port of PORT WALCOTT a Port at which *ad valorem* Goods may be bonded for payment of duty thereat.

Given under my hand and the Public Seal of the Colony, at Perth, this twenty-fourth day of February, 1873.
