PROCLAMATION by His  
Excellency FREDERICK  
ALOYSIUS WELD, Esquire,  
Governor and Commander-  
in-Chief in and over the  
Territory of Western Aus-  
tralia and its Dependencies,  
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Ordinance passed in the fourteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty No. 6, Section V, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of his Executive Council, to appoint by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* any one or more place or places of confinement on the Mainland or on any of the adjacent Islands of this Colony for the reception and detention of Convicts at hard labor, as therein provided. Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, with the advice of my Executive Council, have appointed and do hereby appoint that the *Fremantle Lot C.D.*, mentioned and described in the Schedule to the Ordinance passed in the 14th year of the Reign of Her present Majesty No. 22, together with the Convict Prison now erected thereon, and all houses, yards, stables, and out-buildings used in conjunction therewith and for the purposes of such prison, AND ALSO the Island of Rottneet, AND ALSO the piece of land with the buildings, houses, yards, stables, and appurtenances thereto belonging situate in Fremantle and known by the name of and used as the *Lunatic Asylum*, shall be respectively places of confinement for the reception and detention of Convicts for all the purposes of the said first recited Ordinance.

WHEREAS, by the 68th Section of an Ordinance passed in the 24th year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Ordinance to Amend the Laws of the Customs in "Western Australia," it is enacted "that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of his Executive Council, by his Warrant from time to time to appoint Ports in the said Colony which shall be Warehousing Ports for the purposes of this Ordinance; and also what sorts of goods in addition to Wines, Spirits, and Tobacco may and may only be warehoused and kept and secured without payment of any Duty upon the first entry thereof." Be it therefore known unto all men that I, the Governor aforesaid, have with the advice of my Executive Council appointed and do hereby appoint PORT WALCOTT to be a Warehousing Port, and that *Wines, Beer, Cordials, Spirits, and Tobacco* may be bonded for payment of duty thereat.
