A PROCLAMATION.

HEREAS, by divers Acts of the Imperial Legislation, it is made lawful for the Governor of the Colony of Western Australia for the time being to fix such place within any part of the said Colony, and such time for holding every Session of the Legislative Council of the said Colony, as he may think fit; Now therefore I, Frederick Aloysius Weld, Esquire, being Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so in me vested, do hereby announce and proclaim that a Session of the Legislative Council of Western Australia shall commence and be holden for the despatch of business on the TWENTY-THIRD DAY OF June, 1873, at two o'clock in the afternoon, in the LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL CHAM-BERS, in the CITY OF PERTH, within the said Colony; and the Members of the said Legislative Council are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency FRED-

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, to wit. ERICK ALOYSIUS WELD, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and (L.S.) Fred. A. Weld, over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS I am directed and enjoined by Her Majesty the Queen to "especially take care to pro-"tect the native inhabitants of our said "Colony, and prevent and restrain all "violence and injustice which may in "any manner be practised or attempted "against them;" AND WHEREAS it has heretofore happened and been alleged to have happened that in various parts of this Colony violence and injustice have been practised and attempted against some or sundry of the said native inhabitants, and whereas, moreover, statements have recently been made to the Government of the Colony of South Australia respecting outrages alleged to have been committed on Aboriginal Natives by settlers of this Colony on the frontier, and representations to me to that effect have been made by direction of the Officer Administering the Government of that Colony; Now be it made known to each and every person, and to all persons whom it may concern, that all due and legal means will be made use of to detect and punish such acts of violence and injustice practised or that may be practised upon the person of any of the Aboriginal Inhabitants of Her Majesty's Colony of Western Australia; And I Do furthermore warn each and every person and all persons whom it may concern, that in the event of any collision occurring between any person or persons

whatsoever and Aboriginal Natives of this Colony, in which either in self-defence or for any other just or legal cause it shall have become necessary to use firearms or other weapons, or on any occasion when on any cause or pretence whatsoever such arms shall have been used or any bodily injury whatsoever shall have been inflicted or attempted upon the person of any Aboriginal Native, in any district beyond the usual cognizance and supervision of the police, the person who shall have inflicted such injury, or shall have made use of such weapons with intent to inflict such injury, shall at once report the same to the nearest Police Officer or to the Colonial Secretary; and in default thereof the Magistrates, police and other authorities, are hereby directed, on such occurrence coming to their knowledge, to consider such omission as a primâ facie ground for suspicion, and to take measures in their discretion accordingly, and prosecute according to the provisions of the law.

AUSTRALIAN TIMBER.

MENDERS are invited by the Colonial Secretary, Colombo, for supplying the Colonial Store Department at Colombo, with the following descriptions and quantities of Australian Timber, on the conditions named below:—

200 logs, Red Gum (Eucalyptus Rostrata) 12in. by. 12in.:—50 logs of 20, 50 logs of 30, 50 logs of 40, and 50 logs of 45 feet long.

3000 Planks do. 6 by 4:-2000 of 18 feet long, and 1000 of 15 feet long.

25 logs, Cedar, of the various lengths and dimensions ordinarily procurable.

1000 Red Gum Railway Sleepers, 9 feet by 10 in. by 5 in.

The timber is to be delivered duty paid, and free from all expenses to Government, beyond the Contract price, within the Colonial Store Timber yard on the Galle Buck at Colombo.

The delivery should be completed before April, 1874.

The timber is to be measured and paid for by girth measurement excluding defects, and by the scales of Hoppus' Measure Book, nothing under a quarter of an inch being included; allowance to be made in length for split or defective ends; Queen's caliper or freight measurement is not admitted.

As only straight square timber of the best quality, free from sap and defect, is required, it is clearly to be understood that not under any deduction of measurement, however large, will inferior timber be accepted.

Measurement is to be made in the Timber yard in the presence of such person as may be deputed by the Contractor to superintend and agree upon the measurement, which is to take place as soon as circumstances will allow, no avoidable delay taking place.

Payment will be made for each delivery as soon as possible not exceeding 15 days from the completion of measurement.
