T is hereby notified, for general information, that with a view to encourage the cultivation of the Sugar Cane and the manufacture of Sugar, a Bonus of Two hundred and fifty pounds will be awarded to the person who first produces in this Colony, from the crop of one season and within five years from the first day of January, 1874, five tons of Marketable Sugar, from either the Cane, the Planter's Friend, or the Sugar Beet.

"An Act to further regulate the importation of Cattle Sheep and Pigs," His Excellency The Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to make an order that for a period of two years the importation into Western Australia of Cattle, Sheep, and Pigs is prohibited from all places beyond the Australasian Colonies, and that such period shall be taken to commence from the date of publication of a Notice to the above effect in the "London Times."

SUSSEX DISTRICT.

Location No. 124/43, under Clause 43,—
10 acres.

Bounded on the East by about 6 chains 40 links of the reserve along the side of the tramway at Quindalup. On the North by the South side of Foley Inlet. On the South by the road from Busselton to Dunsbro; and on the West by a North and South line of about 6 chains extending from said road to Foley Inlet.

COCKBURN SOUND DISTRICT.

Location No. 167/43, under Clause 43.— 12 acres.

Bounded on the East by a North line of 5 chains from the North-east corner of Cockburn Sound location 74, and by the Western boundary of said location 74. On the North by a West line of about 15 chains. On the West by a South line of about 12 chains; and on the South by the North boundary of aforesaid location 74, and by the North bank of the Serpentine River.

IS Excellency The Governor has been pleased to approve of the following additional Regulation, applicable to Convicts holding Conditional Releases:

"Any Conditional Release Holder who shall be convicted before any one or more Justice or Justices of the Peace of selling or retailing, either for himself or for any licensed or unlicensed person, any ale, beer, wine, or other spirituous or fer-mented liquor, or of being retained or employed in the care, charge, conducting, or management of any house or place in which a Publican's General License, a Wine and Beer License, or a Wayside House License is exercised, shall at once forfeit his Conditional Release, and shall be liable to be remitted to prison and to revert to his original sentence of Penal Servitude."
