HIS Excellency The Governor desires it to be notified, for general information, that the contribution in respect of all sheep depastured in the Colony to be paid on or before the first day of January, 1874, for defraying the cost and expense of the Scab-in-Sheep Ordinance of 1866, shall be reduced from Two pounds to One pound ten shillings for every one thousand sheep, and so on for any greater or smaller number possessed by one owner.

S.O.L.—SWAN DISTRICT (*Branson's*).
Bounded on the *South* and *East* by lines extending West about 41 chains 66 links, and North about 24 chains, to South boundary of Tillage Lease 6847, from a spot 8 chains East from the North-east corner of S.O.L. 11; the opposite boundaries being parallel and equal. Content—100 acres.

S.O.L.—AVON DISTRICT (*Brown's*, 1).
Bounded on the *South* and *West* by lines extending East 20 chains and North 50 chains from a spot 25 chains South from the South-east corner of S.O.L. 144; the opposite boundaries being parallel and equal. Content—100 acres.
