PROCLAMATION

By His Honor EDWARD DOUGLASS Western Australia, Harvest, Lieutenant-Colonel in Her Majesty's Army and Senior Military Officer in Command of Her Majesty's Land Forces in Western Australia, Administering the Government of Western Aus-Australia and its Dependencies, Administrator. &c., &c., &c.

(L.S.) ED. D. HARVEST.

HEREAS, in the first Session of the Legislative Council of the said Colony holden in the thirty-seventh year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, the following Bills were passed:

"A Bill for raising the sum of One Hundred "Thousand Pounds by Loan for the Con-"struction of certain Public Works;"

and

"A Bill to increase the number of Members "to serve in the Legislative Council and "further to regulate Elections;"

And whereas such Bills were reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon; Now therefore I, Edward Douglass Har-VEST, Administering the Government of the said Colony, do hereby signify and proclaim that such Bills have been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and that Her Majesty has been pleased to Assent to the same.
