IN THE SUPREME COURT OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

*In the Matter of William Graves, of Guildford, in the Colony of Western Australia, Grocer, Tea-dealer, and Storekeeper, Dealer and Chapman, a Bankrupt.*
