IN THE SUPREME COURT OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

In the Matter of William Graves, of Guildford, in the Colony of Western Australia, Grocer, Tea-dealer, and Storekeeper, Dealer and Chapman, a Bankrupt.

JOSEPH SHAW, of Perth, in the Colony of Western' Australia, has been appointed Trustee of the property of the Bankrupt. The Court has appointed the public examination of the Bankrupt to take place on Monday, the 2nd day of March, 1874, at eleven o'clock in the forenoon.
