HEREAS by the First Section of an Act passed in the 34th year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, No. 8, and intituled "An Act to enable the Governor "to extend the 'Fremantle Carriage Ordi-"'nance, 1868,' to other Towns," power is given to the Governor of the said Colony to extend the provisions of such Ordinance to such other Towns as he may deem expedient; Now THEREFORE I, Edward Douglass Harvest, Administering the Government of the said Colony, bo hereby notify and proclaim that I have extended the provisions of the said Ordinance to the Town of York.

Given under my hand and seal at Perth, this seventeenth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and seventyfour, and in the thirty-seventh year of Her Majesty's Reign.

HE Minor Road from the Busselton and Dunsbro Road towards Augusta, as declared by Notice in the Government Gazette of the 10th February, 1874, has been erro-neously described; it is hereby notified, for general information, that the following is the true description of the said road :--

SUSSEX ROAD DISTRICT.

MINOR ROAD,-From the Busselton and Dunsbro Road towards Augusta.

Commencing at a point on the Dunsbro Road 3 chains North and 50 degrees West from the North-west corner of Sussex Location 54; thence running due South 30 chains; thence through a point 5 chains 50 links due South from the South-east corner of Sussex Location 21, thence in a South resteries of Sussex Location 81; thence in a South-westerly direction to the Lennox River, at a spot 20 chains North-north-west from where it is at present *Gazetted* as crossing that River.
