**THE** following boundaries, defining the Williams Residency, are published for general information, viz. :-

WILLIAMS RESIDENCY .- Bounded on the North by a due East line extending from the 41-mile mark on the Perth-Albany Road to the South-western bound-ary of York Residency; thence Eastward along the said York boundary to Millingnalling; then by a due East line. On the West by a line extending about East line. On the *West* by a line extending about West-by-South from the aforesaid 41-mile mark to the junction of the Hotham and Williams Rivers; then by a line extending about West-south-west to the junction of the Arthur, Balgarrup, and Black-wood Rivers; then by a due South line of about 24 miles. On the *South* by a due East line passing through the 175-mile mark on the Perth-Albany Road. All bearings true.

The boundaries of the Murray, Wellington, and Plantagenet Residencies will henceforth be subject to the boundaries of the Williams Residency, so far as they are affected by them.
