PROCLAMATION by His Excellency FREDERICK ALOYSIUS WELD, Esquire,
Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western
Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c.; &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain, passed in the 18th and 19th years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "*An Act to repeal the Acts of Parliament now in force respecting the disposal of the Waste Lands of the Crown in the Australian Colonies, and to make other provisions in lieu thereof,*" it is provided that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by instructions and sign manual, or through one of Her principal Secretaries of State, to regulate the sale, letting, disposal, and occupation of Waste Lands of the Crown in Western Australia, and the disposal of the proceeds arising therefrom, until Parliament shall otherwise provide; And whereas Her Majesty's principal Secretary of State for the Colonies has authorized and instructed me to publish the following Regulations for the sale and disposal of the Waste Lands of the Crown within the said Colony; Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, pursuant to the authority vested in me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and issue the following Regulations, to take effect on and after the seventeenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four.

LAND REGULATIONS.

THE second and third of the Land Regulations contained and promulgated in the Supplement to the *Western Australian Government Gazette* of Tuesday, the 20th of May, 1873, published on Thursday, the 22nd day of May, 1873, are hereby rescinded; and in lieu thereof the following Regulations are substituted:—

A.—*In lieu of the second Regulation*:—Notwithstanding these Regulations, the Governor of the said Colony is authorised, subject to such conditions and limitations as he may think fit, to sell or to except from sale, and either to reserve to Her Majesty, her heirs and succes-

sors, or dispose of in such other manner as for the public interest may seem best, such Lands as may be required for Public Roads or other internal communications, whether by land or water; or for the use or benefit of the aboriginal inhabitants of the country; or for the purposes of military defence; or as the sites of places of public worship, schools, or parsonages, or other public buildings; or as places for the interment of the dead, or places for the recreation and amusement of the inhabitants of any Town or Village; or as the sites of public quays or landing places on the sea coast or shores of navigable streams; or for the con-

struction of Railways or Railway Stations; or for the purpose of sinking shafts and digging for coal, iron, copper, lead, or other minerals and metals; or for any other purpose of public defence, safety, utility, convenience, or enjoyment, or for otherwise facilitating the improvement and settlement of the Colony.

*B.—In lieu of the third Regulation:—*The Governor of Western Australia is authorized and required, in the name and on the behalf of Her Majesty, and upon such terms and conditions as to resumption of the Land or otherwise as to him shall seem fit, to convey and alienate in fee simple, or for any less estate or interest, to the purchaser or purchasers thereof, any Waste Lands of the Crown therein, in such forms and with such solemnities as shall from time to time be prescribed by Her Majesty; and such conveyances and alienations being so made shall be valid and effectual in the Law to transfer to, and to vest in possession in any such purchaser or purchasers any such Lands as aforesaid, for any such estate or interest as by any such conveyance as aforesaid shall be granted to him, her, or them. Until otherwise notified, the Deeds of Grant from the Crown of Waste Lands in Western Australia under these Regulations shall be in the form and words hereto appended in Schedule 1 for Town and Suburban Lands, and Schedule 2 for Country Lands and Mineral Lands, respectively; and for preparing every such deed there shall be charged one uniform fee of twenty shillings, and for recording there shall be charged, also, ten shillings, payable with the purchase-money.

ALL THAT

as the same is delineated in the plan drawn in the margin hereof, TOGETHER with all profits, commodities, hereditaments, and appurtenances whatsoever thereunto belonging, or in anywise appertaining. To HAVE AND TO HOLD the said piece or parcel of Land, and all and singular the Premises hereby granted, with their appurtenances, unto the said
h heirs and assigns, for ever; and they yielding and paying for the same to Us, Our heirs and successors, one peppercorn of yearly rent on the Twenty-fifth day of March in each year, or so soon thereafter as the same shall be lawfully demanded. Provided, nevertheless, that it shall (at any time within twenty-one years from the date of these Presents) be lawful for Us, Our heirs and successors, or for any person or persons acting in that behalf by Our or their authority, to resume and enter upon possession of any part of the same piece or parcel of Ground which it may at any time by Us, Our heirs or successors, be deemed necessary to resume for making roads, canals, bridges, towing-paths, or other works of public utility or convenience, and such lands so resumed to hold to Us, Our heirs and successors, as of Our or their former estate; so nevertheless, that no such resumption be made without compensation of any part of the same piece or parcel of Ground upon which any

expenditure or improvement shall have been made by the said

h heirs and assigns. And We do hereby save and reserve to Us, Our heirs and successors, all mines of gold, silver, and other precious metals, in or under the said piece or parcel of Ground hereby granted, with full liberty at all times to search and dig for, and carry away the same; and, for that purpose, to enter upon the said piece or parcel of Ground, or any part thereof.

In witness whereof, We have caused our trusty and well-beloved _____ Governor and Commander-in-Chief of Our said Colony, to affix to these Presents the Public Seal of the said Colony.

h heirs and assigns for ever; h they yielding and paying for the same to Us, Our heirs and successors, one peppercorn of yearly rent, on the twenty-fifth day of March in each year, or so soon thereafter as the same shall be lawfully demanded. Provided, nevertheless, that it shall at all times be lawful for Us, Our heirs and successors, or for any person or persons acting in that behalf by Our authority, to resume and enter upon possession of any part of the said lands which it may at any time by Us, Our heirs, and successors, be deemed necessary to resume for making roads, tramways, railways, railway stations, canals, bridges, towing paths, or other works of public utility or convenience, and such lands, so resumed to hold to Us, Our heirs and successors, as of Our or their former estate, without making to the said

The shore or land portion is situate on the Eastern part of the Mainland which protects Princess Royal Harbour from the South-eastward, and comprises all that portion, including Geake Island, which lies Westward of a line running due South from the Cairn on the summit of Possession Point, along the connecting beach, and over the land to the inner shore.

The anchorage or sea portion includes all that portion of Princess Royal Harbour which is Southward of a line West magnetic from the Cairn above referred to.

THE following communication is published for the information of Masters of Vessels trading to and from Champion Bay, Western Australia.

Brig "Centaur," Champion Bay,
26th March, 1874.

SIR,—I beg leave to report a Reef which I passed on my passage from Fremantle. This morning, while steering for Moore Point, N.N.W., breakers were reported on the port bow. Being, as near as I could judge, about 5 miles outside the coast reef at the time, I consulted my charts of the coast; 3, the latest, is corrected (1872) by H.M.S. *Clio*. I called Mr. Victor's and Mr. Forrest's attention to it, and we found that it is not marked. I took the bearings of the North end from the ship, centre of the Break West, distant $1\frac{1}{2}$ mile, Mr. Forrest's Trig. Station J N.E. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E., distant about 8 miles, the low black point Port Grey N. by E., distant 12 miles; wind at the time blowing strong from S.S.W., with heavy sea. From the mast-head I could see the coast reef quite plain, and the reef above mentioned to run N.E. and S.W., I should say about 3 miles in extent, breaking heaviest at the extremes. Trusting, Sir, that you will take notice of this for the benefit of shipmasters,
