PROCLAMATION

FRED. A. WELD,

By His Excellency FREDERICK Western Australia, ALOYSIUS WELD, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

THEREAS it is enacted by the second section of the "Small Debts Ordinance, 1863," that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, and at any time by Proclamation published in The Western Australian Government Gazette, to constitute Local Courts for the recovery of Small Debts and Demands, to be holden at such times and places, and within such Districts throughout the said Colony as may be most fit and convenient, and as may be specified in such Proclamation; and likewise by Proclamation to alter the time, or place, or manner of holding any such Courts; and that it has been deemed expedient to alter, as hereinafter specified, the time for holding the Local Court at Guildford; Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, in exercise of such power, do hereby notify and proclaim, that the day for holding a Local Court for the recovery of Small Debts and Demands shall, in the Month of June next and thenceforth, be the last Tuesday in the month.

Given under my hand and the Public Seal of the said Colony, at Government House, Perth, this Eleventh day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, and in the thirty-seventh year of Her Majesty's Reign.

FRED. A. WELD, Governor.

By His Excellency FREDERICK AUSTRALIA, ALOYSIUS WELD, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

THEREAS it is enacted by the 4th Section of an Ordinance passed in the 19th year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, No. 12, intituled "An Ordinance for the better Registration of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in the Colony of Western Australia," that the Governor may, for the purposes of such Ordinance, divide the said Colony into such and so many Registry Districts as he shall think fit, one of them being the Registry District of Perth. and may in like manner, by any subsequent proclamation, from time to time alter such division: Now THEREFORE I, Frederick Aloysius Weld, The Governor aforesaid, with the advice of my Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that, in addition to the Districts already proclaimed, the District of Williams, according to the following boundaries, shall be considered a Registry District for the purposes of the said Ordinance:—On the North by a due East line extending from the 41-mile mark on the Perth-Albany Road to the South Western boundary of York Residency; thence Eastward along the said York boundary to Millingnalling; then by a due East line. On the West by a line extending about West-by-South from the aforesaid 41-mile mark to the junction of the Hotham and Williams Rivers; then by a line extending about West-south-west to the junction of the Arthur, Balgarrup, and Blackwood Rivers;

then by a due South line of about 24 miles. On the South by a due East line passing through the 175-mile mark on the Perth-Albany Road. All bearings true.

THE following communication is published for the information of Masters of Vessels trading to and from Champion Bay, Western Australia.

MALCOLM FRASER, Surveyor General.

Brig "Centaur," Champion Bay, 26th March, 1874.

SIR,—I beg leave to report a Reef which I passed on my passage from Fremantle. This morning, while steering for Moore Point, N.N.W., breakers were reported on the port bow. Being, as near as I could judge, about 5 miles outside the coast reef at the time, I consulted my charts of the coast; 3, the latest, is corrected (1872) by H.M.S. Cho. I called Mr. Victor's and Mr. Forrest's attention to it, and we found that it is not marked. I took the bearings of the North end from the ship, centre of the Break West, distant 1½ mile, Mr. Forrest's Trig. Station J N.E. by E. ½ E., distant about 8 miles, the low black point Port Grey N. by E., distant 12 miles; wind at the time blowing strong from S.S.W., with heavy sea. From the mast-head I could see the coast reef quite plain, and the reef above mentioned to run N.E. and S.W., I should say about 3 miles in extent, breaking heaviest at the extremes. Trusting, Sir, that you will take notice of this for the benefit of shipmasters,
