Council for the prevention of Dangerous Fires, has been confirmed by His Excellency The Governor, with the advice of his Executive Council.

Bye-Law Busselton Municipality.

"Any person who shall, after the first day of August next, build, erect, or construct, or cause to be built, erected, or constructed, on any portion of the Municipality of Busselton bounded on the East by "Stanley Street, on the West by West Street, on the "North by the Sea Beach, and on the South by "Bussell Street and Pest Terrace, any stack of grain, "hay, or straw, or any dwelling-house, out-house, or building, or roof of whatever nature, of rush, straw, "bark, grass-tree-top, or any other inflammable "substance or material of the like nature, shall, on "conviction thereof before one or more Justices of "the Peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence "any sum not exceeding £20. And any such stack, "dwelling-house, out-house, building, or roof, which "shall hereafter be constructed as aforesaid shall "be deemed a public nuisance, and shall be liable "to be removed and abated accordingly. And "any such stack, building, or roof as aforesaid now in existence shall, on and after the first day of "January, 1875, be deemed a public nuisance, and the liable to be shoted or removed accordingly." "be liable to be abated or removed accordingly.
