Bombay New Prongs Lighthouse.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

NOTICE is hereby given, that on the 1st of November, 1874, the present Revolving Light on Colaba Point will be abolished, and a Revolving Holophotal Dioptic White Light of the first Order will be exhibited from the New Prongs Lighthouse, showing a flash at an interval of 10 seconds, visible 19 to 21 Miles.

Latitude 18deg. 52min. 41sec. North.

Longitude 72deg. 47min. 26sec. East.

The Lighthouse is painted with circular bands White, Red, White, and Black, and the height of the Light is 146 feet above mean sea level, situated on the centre of the dangers, which extend from this Lighthouse, on a radius of 1½ miles, bearing from East by South round southward to West by North with the following bearings from the new Lighthouse by compass:—

Old Lighthouse, Colaba Point—N. 34deg. E.
distant 1½ miles.

Thull Knob—S. 46deg. E.

Elephanta Peak—N. 56deg. E.

Oyster Rock Battery—N. 48deg. E.
