**D**Y virtue of the Ordinance No. 15 of 1855, and the Act of Council 37 Vict., No. 14, I DO HEREBY Proclaim the Regulations hereunder, which have been framed by me with the advice of the Executive Council for the observance of all Masters and Commanders of all ships and vessels using the Moorings at Port Irwin.

Given under my hand and the Public Seal of the Colony, at Government House, Perth, this twentieth day of July, 1874.

#### GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!!!

REGULATIONS to be observed by Vessels using the Moorings at Port Irwin.

Vessels making fast to the Moorings must lift the buoy and small chain, and unshackle them from the large mooring chain, to which they will shackle their own chains, taking care to place the buoy and small chain in a place of safety.

In casting off from the moorings the small chain and buoy must be securely shackled on to the large chain before it is let go.

Any person or persons violating the foregoing Regulations, or who shall through neglect or carelessness damage the moorings, is liable, on conviction, to the penalties named in the Ordinance 18th Vict., No. 15, and the Act of Council 37th Vict., No. 14.
