Quartz Crushing Battery.

Thatched Roofs.

By-Law Bunbury Municipality.

No person shall, after the 1st day of September next, build, erect, or construct, or cause to be built, erected, or constructed, on any portion of the Municipality of Bunbury, any stack of grain, hay, or straw, or any dwelling-house, out-house, or building, or roof of whatever nature, of rush, straw, bark, or any other inflammable substance or material of the like nature, under a penalty for every such offence of a sum not exceeding £20. And any such stack, dwelling-house, outhouse, building, or roof which shall hereafter be constructed as aforesaid shall be liable to be removed and abated in the terms of the 34th section of "The Municipal Institutions' Act, 1871." And any such stack, building, or roof as aforesaid now in existence shall on and after the 1st day of January, 1876, be deemed a public nuisance, and be liable to be abated or removed accordingly.
