PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency WILLIAM WESTERN AUSTRALIA, CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, Esquire, a Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over WILLIAM C. F. ROBINSON, the territory of Western Aus-Governor. tralia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS by an Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain, passed in the 18th and 19th years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to repeal "the Acts of Parliament now in force respect-"ing the disposal of the Waste Lands of the "Crown in the Australian Colonies, and to "make other provisions in lieu thereof," it is provided that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by instructions under her sign manual, or through one of her Principal Secretaries of State, to regulate the sale, letting, disposal, and occupation of Waste Lands of the Crown in Western Australia, and the disposal of the proceeds arising therefrom, until Parliament shall otherwise provide; And whereas, in pursuance of instructions received from Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies, certain Regulations theretofore made as aforesaid for the sale and disposal of the Waste Lands of the Crown within the Colony were published on the 22nd day of May, in the year of our Lord 1873; And whereas it has appeared to Her Majesty expedient to amend such Regulations, and Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies has accordingly authorised and instructed me to proclaim in the usual manner the following additional Land Regulations, which are to be supplementary to and considered as part of the said

Regulations proclaimed on the 22nd day of May, 1873; Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, pursuant to the authority vested in me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and issue the following regulations, to be supplementary to and considered as part of the said Regulations published as aforesaid, and which are to take effect on and after the first day of March, 1875.

LAND REGULATIONS.

Free Grants of Land to Immigrants.

- 1. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the existing Land Regulations contained, each adult Immigrant of the laboring classes introduced into the Colony with the sanction, or wholly or partially the Colony with the sanction, or wholly or partially at the expense of the Imperial or Colonial Government, after two years' residence therein, may, with the permission of the Governor or Officer Administering the Government, select from any unimproved Rural Crown Lands open to selection, a lot not exceeding fifty acres; and, subject to the same conditions, each such immigrant between the ages of conditions, each such immigrant between the ages of conditions, each such immigrant between the green and twenty one may select a lot not exceed. sixteen and twenty-one may select a lot not exceeding twenty-five acres of such land; Provided that no greater quantity of land than 150 acres in all be allotted under these Regulations to any one family.
- 2. Such lots, when selected, are to be allotted in the first instance to such immigrants by Occupation Certificates, which may be exchanged for grants in fee simple at the expiration of three years from the date of such Certificate respectively, on proof to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of Crown Lands that the whole of the land so allotted shall then have been properly fenced in, and that at least one-fourth of it is under cultivation. Provided that if at the end of the said term of three years the above conditions, or any of them, be not fulfilled, the lot in

respect of which default shall have been made shall revert to the Crown, with any improvements that may be thereon.

Licenses to cut Timber.

- 3. In order to promote the introduction and establishment of new industries, and commercial undertakings of public utility, it shall be lawful for the Governor or Officer Administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, to grant Special Licenses to cut and remove timber from the waste lands of the Crown for any period not exceeding 14 years, anything to the contrary notwithstanding in the existing Land Regulations contained; and such licenses shall be subject to such rents, fees, conditions, and reservations as the Governor in Council may prescribe, but shall not entitle the licensees to any right of renewal at the expiration of the term.
- 4. Any Timber License already granted, or agreed to be granted, for a longer period than 12 months, with a right of renewal, and otherwise not in conformity with the existing Land Regulations, shall not on that account be held to be invalid, but may be held and renewed according and subject to the terms and stipulations on which the license was granted, or agreed to be granted.

NOTICE TO SHIPMASTERS.

Engagement of Foreign Seamen on board of British Ships.

The attention of British Shipmasters, and of Foreign Seamen wishing to ship on board British vessels, is hereby called to the provisions of the Laws of certain Countries with regard to Military and Naval Service, which forbid the engagement of the subjects of those Countries on Foreign Service unless they are provided with Certificates from the competent Authorities to the effect that there is no objection to their accepting such service.

Masters of British Ships, and Seamen being the subjects of Foreign Countries are therefore warned that unless the latter are provided with the Certificates from the Authorities above referred to any engagements they may make to serve on board British vessels may be considered illegal according to the Laws of those Countries, and that the whole responsibility and consequences of concluding such engagements will have to be borne by the parties to the Contract, who must not expect any interference on their behalf on the part of Her Majesty's Government or of any British Consular Officer.
