WHEREAS by the Colonial Passengers' Amendment Ordinance of 1868, it is enacted from the first day of January, 1869, every colonial vessel shall be commanded by a master possessing a certificate from the Board of Trade, or, in the absence of such, a certificate from a Local Board to be named by the Governor, it is hereby notified, for the information of persons desirous of obtaining Certificates of Competency as masters, that His Excellency The Governor has appointed a Board of Officers consisting of

The Harbor Master,

 Rottnest Island,  
 A Certificated Master Mariner,

to examine such persons at Fremantle.

Applicants for Certificates of Competency will be required to pass an examination on the following points:—

*As a Second Class Master :*

Reading and Writing.  
 Course and distance by Mercator's method, or middle latitude sailing.  
 Day's work, or dead reckoning.  
 Latitude by meridian altitude of both sun and star.  
 Variation of the compass by amplitudes.  
 General seamanship and management of vessels.  
 Cross bearings by compass, and use of charts, use of sextant, quadrant, lead and log line.  
 General knowledge of "protests, surveys, &c.," requisite for a ship-master.  
 General knowledge of the coasts and harbors which the candidate intends to trade on.

Every Candidate must be twenty-one years of age, and must show proof that he has been five years at sea.

*As a First Class Master :*

In addition to the qualifications of a Second Class Master,  
Longitude by Chronometer.  
Variation and deviation by Azimuth.

*Fees to be paid by Applicants for Examination :*

Master's Certificate, 1st or 2nd Class, £1.  
One-half to be returned in case of failure.

Any person in possession of a Second Class Certificate will be allowed to pass an extra examination for a First Class Certificate without payment of any fee; but if he fail in the first examination, half a master's fee will be charged for every subsequent attempt.

Every applicant who passes a satisfactory examination, and has given satisfactory evidence of his sobriety, experience, and ability, will be granted a Certificate of Competency in the following form, viz. :—

THIRTY-SIXTH NOTICE.

S.O.L.—COCKBURN SOUND (*San Miguel's*).

Bounded on the *South* and *East* by lines extending North 33 chains 33 links and West 30 chains from a spot 16 chains 50 links South and 15 chains East from a tree marked  $\wedge$  the said tree being situate about 39 chains in direction about North from the North-west corner of Tillage Lease 7127; the opposite boundaries being parallel and equal, and bearings true.
