N accordance with the provisions of Number Twenty-six of the "Regulations for the Sale, Letting, Disposal, and Occupation of the Waste Lands of the Crown within the Colony of Western Australia," His Excellency The Governor in Council has been pleased to make the Rules and Directions hereunder given as following and in addition to those already publicly notified, and dated 19th August, 1873.

21. In observing for true bearing (which should always be done, in traverse work, at least every 10 miles, and in every other survey except single blocks

attached to old work) first observe a meridian altitude of the sun or a star for latitude, the result should not be more than one mile from the truth; then observe the greatest elongation of any circum-polar star with the verniers clamped at 360°, clamp the lower plate and reverse the telescope, set the cross wires again on the star and read the verniers, the mean reading will give the correct direction of the star at its greatest elongation; then compute the angle between that line and a true South line by the formula Log. sine of polar distance minus Log. cosine of the Latitude=Log. sine of angle required; set off that angle on the vernier and the telescope will point true South. A circumpolar star is at its greatest elongation when its altitude is about 34° to 36° in these latitudes.

22. Plans sent to this office must be in strict accordance with the prescribed form adopted.

All connected surveys are to be plotted so as 23.to show all the connections in their proper relative positions, and if such run outside the sheet line, another sheet must be added in its proper place (*i.e.* :—exactly over, under, or on one side, as the case may be).

24. Isolated blocks to be plotted on the diagram forms only, with connection, topography, description of country, &c., within its boundaries. Only one block to go on one form, and on as large a scale as diagram forms allow.

25. Whenever practicable, new surveys are to be plotted on the sheets already in the office, showing all the blocks, &c., in their proper relative positions, but the sheets that show scattered blocks are not to be used for such purpose.

Calculated distances not to be written on the plan but on the proper column in the tables provided for that purpose, and should always be North and South, East and West (true). If the intermediate pegs are not exactly ten chains apart the distance is to be written on the plan.

27. The measure of all angles that are not right angles are to be written on the plan.

28. Additional town surveys are to be plotted on the existing town plans if possible; if not, on a sheet on a scale of not less than four chains to one inch, showing all the details, connections with old sur-veys, &c. The diagram forms are not to be used for town lots.

29. The boundaries of lands fronting on lakes or rivers are to be marked on the ground by lines, and so distinguished on the plans the same as the other boundaries.

30. The starting point referred to in the application to purchase, must always be shown on the plan.

31. A proper authority must always be obtained before marking any land in a different form from that shown in the copy of application furnished by the office.

32. No theodolite less than a five-inch to be used, except by special permission.

After this date, in consideration of the present 33. advanced rate of wages now being paid throughout the Colony, the Surveyor General may allow, in addition to the fees payable to surveyors under Number 18 of the Rules and Directions, such amounts as shall not exceed one-fifth or 20 per cent. on the whole account.
