AUSTRALIA-NORTH-EAST COAST. INNER ROUTE LEADING TO TORRES STRAIT. ESTABLISHMENT OF BEACONS ON REEFS AND ISLANDS.

With reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 74 of 1875, on the establishment of beacons to facilitate the navigation of the route leading to Torres Strait:-

The Colonial Government of Queensland has given further notice, that the following additional beacons have been erected in the inner route leading to Torres Strait.
