Transfer of Land Act 1874

NOTICE

HEREAS it is provided by § 15 of the above Act that "The grants in fee or for years of all Crown Lands remaining unalienated at the time of the commencement of this Act" [that is to say July 1st 1875] "shall be delivered not to the grantee but to the Registrar who shall retain the same &c"

And whereas many such grants have been delivered to the grantees and not to the Registrar and are now in the possession of the grantees or of their transferees or of other persons not being the Registrar

And whereas all transactions taking place with respect to such lands are void unless they shall have been done in conformity with the provisions of the above Act

Now it is hereby ordered that all persons having in their possession grants from the Crown bearing a date subsequent to the above mentioned day shall forward the same to me together with all conveyances or charges or any memoranda purporting to convey or to charge or to affect the land the subject of such transactions And shall also forward at the same time a declaration in writing attested by a Justice of the Peace or notary public either declaring that there have not been nor are any transactions affecting the land or that there have not been nor are any transactions other than those which are forwarded at the same time with the Crown grant
