# PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency WILLIAM WESTERN AUSTRALIA, CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, Esquire, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over WILLIAM C. F. ROBINSON, the territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

N pursuance of the provisions of the 16th section of an Ordinance record in the 16th section of an Ordinance passed in the 19th year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Ordinance to "consolidate and amend the Laws respecting "the licensing of Boats and Boatmen," I po HEREBY notify and proclaim that the Regulations hereunto annexed have been framed by me, the said Governor, in Executive Council, as the General Regulations for the manage-ment and use of all Public Jetties at the several ports of the said Colony.

Given under my hand, and issued under the Public Seal of the said Colony, at Government House, Perth, this 14th day of February, 1876.

## GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!!!

GENERAL REGULATIONS for the management and use of all Public Jetties at the several Ports of the Colony of Western Australia, framed by the Governor of the said Colony, in Executive Council, in accordance with the provisions of the Ordinance 19th Victoria, No. 15.

1. Goods may be landed or shipped at the Public Jetties at Fremantle and the Out-Ports, during any hour after sunrise and before sunset, excepting Goods unshipped from vessels arriving from parts

beyond seas, which must be landed in accordance with the 31st section of the Customs Ordinance. No Vessel, Cargo, or other Boat or Flat shall be made fast or be suffered to be alongside such Jetties for the purpose of discharging or taking in cargo after sunset or before sumise, and no such Vessels, Boats, or Flats whatever, other than such as are at the time landing or embarking Passangers shall remain landing or embarking Passengers, shall remain alongside, or hang to such Jetties after sunset or before sunrise, except by special permission from the Officer in charge at Fremantle or the Resident Magistrate at Out-Ports.

2. Such Vessels, Boats, or Flats shall not be fastened to any part of such Jetties, except to such ring bolts or other fastenings as are or may be pro-vided for the purpose; and such Vessels, Boats, or Flats shall not be alongside of such Jetties unless so fastened. All such Vessels, Boats, or Flats so fastened, shall also be anchored or moored in such manner as to relieve such Jetties as much as possible from the weight of such craft; and in no case shall more than one tier of such Vessels, Boats, or Flats lie alongside or be fastened to any of such Jetties, or be moored or fastened to other Vessels, Boats, or Flats lying alongside of any such Jetties, except on special permission of the Officer in charge.

3. Such Vessels, Boats, or Flats shall not be so moored or fastened as aforesaid, except for the pur-pose of loading or unloading, nor for any longer period during the authorised hours than shall be reasonably required for such purpose.

4. Passenger Boats only may lie alongside the steps on such Jetties, and for no longer period than may be necessary to embark or disembark Passengers.

5. All such Vessels, Boats, or Flats lying along-side any such Jetties shall, on the approach thereto of a Passenger Steamer, be hauled off to a sufficient distance to enable her to disembark or embark Passengers.

6. No person shall fish on such Jetties.

 No person shall fish on such Jettles.
 Stones, Bricks, Clay, Sand, Lime, Coals, Coke, or other fuel (except in bags) shall not be landed or placed on such Jettles, except imported Bricks and Paving Stone, which latter must be removed immediately. Firewood may be trucked on such Jettles for the use of Passenger Steamers and other Vessels or Boats, and taken direct from the truck to the Vessel. No Goods shall be handed over the price of such Jettles. rails of such Jetties.

8. All Goods, Chattels, and Merchandize placed on such Jetties shall be removed therefrom before sunset, unless specially permitted to remain by the Officer in charge thereof.

9. Tramways and Trucks provided for the use of such Jetties shall, where so provided, be used for the transit of Goods, Chattels, and Merchandize on, to, and from such Jetties. Bullock or horse teams, or any wheeled vehicle drawn by any quadruped or quadrupeds, shall not be driven on or permitted to go on any such Jetty. Persons riding on horseback on such Jetties shall proceed at a foot's pace.

10. Gunpowder shall not be landed or left on such Jetties without a keeper, nor without being well covered with a Tarpaulin, and shall be removed with all possible despatch. No Gunpowder shall be landed on the New Jetty at Fremantle.

11. All Goods landed from the sea must be landed at the Sea Jetties, and Boatmen are to expose to view the marks and numbers of all Packages so landed; and no Goods shall be landed at any other place without first obtaining the permission of the Collector of Customs or other proper authority.

12. Goods shall not be landed on such Jetties on a Sunday, Christmas Day, or Good Friday, or other Public Holidays, except in cases of extreme emergency (the special authority of the Collector or other principal officer of Customs or Officer in charge thereof being first obtained).

13. All Goods trucked on such Jetties must be carefully removed from the trucks, and not shot off them.

14. No Stones or other kind of substance whatever shall be thrown into the water from such Jetties.

15. No person shall make fast any Tackle, Purchase, or other Gear, to any part of the Cranes placed at the ends of the Jetties, except such gear as is furnished by the Government for the working of the Crane.

16. Not more than one ton shall be lifted with single half-inch chain, or two tons with a single block added. On a single five-eighth chain not more than 33 cwt. shall be lifted, or 66 cwt. with one single block. For heavier weights the number of parts of the chain shall be increased in proportion to the weight to be lifted; but not more than five tons shall be put upon any Crane without special arrangements with the Officer in charge.

17. Any Steam Vessel plying on the coast of this Colony shall be permitted to lie alongside any Jetty for the purpose of discharging or taking in Cargo at all hours of the day and night, consistently with the Regulations.

18. All steamers when lying at a Jetty shall have and use two up and down fenders made of rope, and outside the up and down fenders a fore and aft rope fender of sufficient length and thickness to keep the guard streak entirely clear of the fender piles.

# REGULATIONS applicable to the Sea Jetties at Fremantle only.

1. Vessels discharging or receiving Cargo at the Jetties, and having the use of a Donkey Engine for the purpose, will be required to pay a wharfage rate of sixpence per ton on Cargo so shipped or discharged. No charge will be made for the use of the Cranes if worked by labor provided by the Vessels.

2. Consignees and Shippers will be required to pay a charge of one shilling and sixpence per ton on all Goods landed or shipped at the Jetties, such charge including all labour in trucking on the Jetties and Platforms. The tonnage will be computed according to the scale of measurement adopted by the Chamber of Commerce at Fremantle.

3. Vessels will unload in the order in which they arrive and are placed in a list to be kept by the Officer in charge of the Jetties. Application to be placed in turn on this list according to arrival must be made to the Officer at least the evening before the Vessel requires to unload. If such application be not made the next Vessel on the list takes precedence, but the vessel forfeiting her turn may be placed next in succession. Vessels will load according to the order of application to the Officer in Charge, and shall, when required by him, give place to Vessels discharging Cargo. Vessels arriving from or bound to foreign Ports will have precedence of coasting and other craft.

4. No goods are to remain on the Platforms for more than 48 hours.

5. In cases of emergency the Collector of Customs may in his discretion grant permission to land goods at any time of the night or day, notice of such permission being given to the Officer in charge of Jetties.

6. In cases where special permission is granted by the Collector of Customs for the landing of goods from beyond the seas at the River Jetty or on the Beach, the same wharfage charges will be levied as are chargeable on goods landed at the sea Jetties.

7. When the Harbor Master may deem it unsafe, through stress of weather, for a vessel to remain alongside a Jetty, he shall request the Officer in charge thereof to direct the immediate removal of such vessel.

8. Vessels exceeding one hundred tons register shall not be allowed more than 24 hours for loading or discharging every hundred tons of cargo. Provided that this regulation shall not apply in cases of special permission under Regulation 5.

9. All foreign-going Vessels shall be moored alongside the Jetties by the Harbor Master in such position as may be indicated by the Officer in Charge thereof, who will, if necessary, direct the removal of other craft for that purpose.

10. In the event of any Vessel or Vessels being moored alongside any of the Jetties at Fremantle in such way as to exclude any other Vessel or Vessels whose Owners or Masters wish also to moor her or them alongside consistently with the Regulations, the Officer in Charge thereof has power hereby to order the removal of such Vessel or Vessels to another berth or berths, and thus afford a berth or berths for such Vessel or Vessels so wishing to moor alongside such Jetty.

11. The approaches to the Jetties shall be used only by persons to whom the land may be allotted for wharfage purposes, and the Officer in charge thereof is empowered to order unauthorised persons to vacate the same forthwith. No goods shall remain on the approaches to the Jetties for a longer period than 48 hours.

SOUTH AUSTRALIA.

Chief Secretary's Office, Adelaide, 5th January, 1876.

I have the honor to inform you that an Act of the South Australian Parliament [No. 10 of 1875] has been assented to (of which I enclose a copy), authorising the Governor of this Province to enter into an Agreement with the Governor of either of the Australian Colonies and New Zealand, for the admission of all or any articles (spirits and tobacco excepted) the produce or manufactured from the produce of any of the said Colonies free from Customs duties, upon the condition referred to in that Act.

I have further to intimate to you that the Governor of South Australia will be prepared to enter into an Agreement with the Governor of Western Australia (for a period of five years) for the admission into South Australia free from Customs Duties of the Articles the produce of or manufactured from the produce of Western Australia, mentioned in the Schedule attached, provided the Governor of Western Australia will at the same time enter into an Agreement with the Governor of this Province to admit the like articles the produce or manufactures of South Australia in the Ports of Western Australia free from all Customs Duties.

This Government being fully impressed with the great advantages that will in all probability accrue to the people of this Continent from an unrestricted interchange of the products of its varied soil and climate, are desirous of carrying out the principle to its fullest extent; but should your Government be unable to agree to insert in the proposed treaty all the articles mentioned, they trust you will be able to propose a modification thereof, in order that a definite conclusion may be arrived at as early as possible.

A similar communication has been addressed to the Governments of New South Wales, Victoria, Tasmania, Queensland, and New Zealand.

#### Perth City Council.

HEREAS "The Council and Burgesses of the City of Dell" W of the City of Perth" commonly known as "The Perth City Council" are empowered under the 43rd section of "The Municipal Institutions' Act 1871" with the sanction of His Excellency The Governor with the advice of the Executive Council in writing under his hand to borrow by way of mortgage on the credit of their annual revenues any monies not exceeding in the whole the estimated revenue of the said Council for three years for or towards or incidental to the making carrying on or completing any permanent improvement within their Municipality and it is by the same section provided that when any money has been borrowed the said Council shall assess and collect a general rate not exceeding sixpence in the pound for each half-year (such general rate to be in addition to the annual rate mentioned in the 46th section of the said Act) until the same shall have been thereby paid.

And whereas the said Council have with the sanction aforesaid signified as aforesaid borrowed by way of mortgage on the credit of their annual revenues a sum of money not exceeding the said limitation for the purpose of making carrying on and completing certain permanent improvements within their Municipality. And whereas in pursuance of the requirements of the said 43rd section of the said Act the said Council on the twenty-eighth day of June in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five assessed a general rate of sixpence in the pound for each half-year upon all rateable property within the limits of their Municipality until the said debt should have been thereby paid and it was provided by "The Perth Drainage Rate Act 1875" that the said rate should after the expiration of the half-year ending on the twenty-eighth day of December in the year of Our Lord one thousand eighth hundred and seventy-five be and be deemed a nullity except for the purpose of recovering any outstanding arrears of the same and that the said Council should be authorised and required on and after the said twentyeighth day of December to declare and collect a general rate not exceeding sixpence in the pound for each half-year from its declaration towards the liquidation of the said debt as if the said rate declared as aforesaid on the said twenty-eighth day of June had never been made. And whereas notice of the same has been duly given in two local newspapers to wit "The Western Aus-tralian Times" and "The Inquirer" on the first day of February and the second day of February last respectively and also subsequent thereto and that the particulars of the same may be inspected as aforesaid.
