BAY OF BENGAL—COROMANDEL COAST— MADRAS.

PROHIBITED ANCHORAGE NEAR THE BRITISH INDIAN SUBMARINE TELEGRAPH CABLE.

The Madras Government has given notice, with a view to the prevention of damage to the British Indian Submarine Telegraph Cable, and under the provisions of the "Indian Conservancy Act," that all vessels are strictly prohibited from anchoring in any part of the Madras Roadstead to the southward any part of the matrix roadstead to the sometime of the lighthouse. Vessels arriving from the Colonies with horses should anchor in not less than 7 fathoms water, with the lighthouse bearing from West to W. by S., and nothing to the southward of the former bearing. Commanders infringing these directions will be prosecuted under the provisions of Act VII of 1875. Act XII of 1875.
