WHEREAS the Legislative Council of this Colony stands prorogued to the third day of July, proximo, and whereas by divers Acts of the Imperial Legislature it is made lawful for the Governor of the Colony of Western Australia for the time being to fix such place within any part of the said Colony, and such time for holding every Session of the said Legislative Council of the said Colony, as he may think fit; Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, as aforesaid, do hereby, in exercise of the powers in me vested, further prorogue the said Legislative Council to Monday, the seventh day of August, next ensuing, THEN TO MEET FOR THE DESPATCH OF BUSINESS, in the Legislative Council Chamber, in the City of Perth, at the hour of three o'clock in the afternoon; and the MEMBERS of the said Legislative Council are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

To the Colonial Secretary, Western Australia.

SIR,—I am desired by the Right Honorable the Governor-General of India in Council, to acquaint you, for the information of His Excellency the Governor, that Mr. W. Thacker, Staff Veterinary Surgeon and Remount Agent, Calcutta, has been deputed by the Government of India to proceed to Australia this season, to purchase about twenty well-bred stallions fit for immediate use, and as many more yearlings or two-year old colts, and to state that His Excellency the Governor-General in Council will be much obliged if the Government of Western Australia will afford that officer any assistance he may require.
