By His Excellency WILLIAM WESTERN AUSTRALIA, to wit. CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, Esquire, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over (L.S.) the territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WILLIAM C. F. ROBINSON.

HEREAS the Legislative Council of this Colony stands prorogued to the third day of July, proximo, and whereas by divers Acts of the Imperial Legislature it is made lawful for the Governor of the Colony of Western Australia for the time being to fix such place within any part of the said Colony, and such time for holding every Session of the said Legislative Council of the said Colony, as he may think fit; Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, as aforesaid, do hereby, in exercise of the powers in me vested, further prorogue

the said Legislative Council to Monday, the seventh day of August, next ensuing, THEN TO MEET FOR THE DESPATCH OF BUSINESS, in the Legislative Council Chamber, in the City of Perth, at the hour of three o'clock in the afternoon; and the MEMBERS of the said Legislative Council are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.
