Sir,—I have the honor to transmit to you for your information and for publication in the Colony under your Government, a copy of a Declaration signed at Rome on the 22nd May, prolonging the duration of the Treaty of Commerce and Navigation between Her Majesty and the King of Italy, of the 6th of August, 1863.

DECLARATION prolonging the duration of the Treaty of Commerce and Navigation between Her Majesty and the King of Italy of the 6th of August, 1863.

Signed at Rome, May 22, 1876.

Whereas the Treaty of Commerce and Navigation between Great Britain and Italy of 6th August, 1863, would cease to be in force on the 26th June, 1876, in consequence of a denunciation made by the Italian Government, and the two Governments having recognised the utility of prolonging its duration, the Undersigned, duly authorised to this effect, have agreed to declare as follows:—

The Treaty of Commerce and Navigation between Great Britain and Italy of the 6th August, 1863, will continue to remain in force until the 30th April, 1877.

In faith of which they have signed the present Declaration, made in duplicate, and have affixed their seals.

Done at Rome, on the 22nd of May, 1876.

WHEREAS by "The Foreign Deserters Act, 1852," it is provided that whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities are or will be given for recovering or apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in the territories of any foreign power, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, stating that such facilities are or will be given, declare that seamen, not being slaves, who desert from merchant ships belonging to such power when within Her Majesty's dominions shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships, and may limit the operation of such Order, and may render the operation thereof subject to such conditions and qualifications, if any, as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities are given for recovering

NOW, THEREFORE, Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Her by the said "Foreign Deserters Act, 1852," and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that from and after the publication hereof in the London Gazette, convent at height players and not help always and the publication. seamen not being slaves, and not being British subjects, who, within Her Majesty's dominions, desert from merchant ships belonging to the empire of Brazil shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships.

NOW, THEREFORE, Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Her by the said "Foreign Deserters Act, 1852," and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that from and after the publication hereof in the London Gazette, seamen, not being slaves, and not being British subjects, who, within Her Majesty's dominions, desert from merchant ships belonging to the Regency of Tunis shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships.

Provided always, that if any such deserter has committed any crime in Her Majesty's dominions he may be detained until he has been tried by a competent court, and until his sentence (if any) has been fully carried into effect.

And the Secretaries of State for India in Council, the Home Department, and the Colonies, are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Conveyance of the Albany Mail.

**ENDERS (endorsed "Tenders for Albany Mail,") will be received at this Office until noon of Thursday, the 21st of September, 1876, for the conveyance of a second mail between Perth and Albany, once in every four weeks, from a date to be fixed on acceptance of Tender, for one, two, or three years. Each trip to be performed in 72 hours, subject to a

penalty of £1 for each hour in excess of that time, to be deducted from the Contractor's monthly pay.

The mails must be carried in a four-wheeled spring vehicle.

The Contractor will be required to convey the mails at such dates in each month as the Postmaster-General may fix.

The Contractor will be required to convey and deliver all Inland Mails en route which may be entrusted to him under the authority of the Postmaster-General, and provide secure and watertight covers for the mails.

Two approved sureties will be required to join the Contractor in a guarantee for the due fulfilment of the Contract.

No payments on account of the Contract will be made until a Bond shall have been signed by the Contractor and his sureties; and any breach of Contract will subject the Contractor to a loss of a proportionate part of his monthly pay or the cancellation of his Contract.

The Contractor will be required to provide an officer of the Post Office or Telegraph Department with a free passage to and from Albany, when required to do so.

The Contractor will be required to provide a free passage for a Mail Guard, if called upon to do so by the Postmaster-General.

The Government will reserve to themselves the right to terminate the Contract at any time by giving three months' notice.

SOUTH PACIFIC OCEAN.

POSITIONS OF BOSCAWEN AND KEPPEL ISLANDS AND OF CURACOA REEF.

With reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 47, dated 21st April, 1876, on the positions of Boscawen and Keppel islands and Curaçoa reef:—the following is an amendment in regard to the positions contained in that Notice, viz.:-

BANKS STRAIT-TASMANIA.

(1) SUNKEN ROCKS OFF EDDYSTONE POINT.

Information has been received from Staff Commander Henry Stanley, R.N., in charge of Admirally Survey, Victoria, of the existence of three outlying dangers (Victoria rocks) off Eddystone point, Tasmania, viz.:—

One rock, with 5 feet water on it at low water, lying E. by N. ½ N., two-thirds of a mile from the point, and N.N.E., half a mile from Eddystone rock. The second rock, with 14 feet on it, East, one mile from Eddystone point, and N.E. by E. ½ E., three-quarters of a mile from Eddystone rock; and the third rock, with 10 feet on it at low water, E.N.E., a quarter of a mile from Eddystone rock.

AUSTRALIA-VICTORIA-PORT PHILLIP.

(2) JETTY LIGHT AT SORRENTO.

NEW ZEALAND-MIDDLE ISLAND-OTAGO HARBOUR.

LEADING LIGHTS FOR OUTER BAR.

The Colonial Government of New Zealand has given Notice, that from the 1st April 1876 two leading lights would be exhibited from towers erected on the sites of the two beacons hitherto used as a leading mark for crossing the outer bar.

The towers bear from each other N.N.E. and S.S.W., distant 300 yards.

The upper, or inner, light is a fixed green light, elevated 36 feet above the level of the sea. The lower, or seaward, light is a fixed white light, elevated 26 feet above the sea. Both lights are visible through an arc of 75 degrees, or between the bearings of S. 41° E. and S. 34° W., and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 6 to 7 miles.

RED LIGHT AT PILOT STATION.

A small fixed red light, not visible seaward, would be exhibited on the red and white beacon at the Pilot station inside Tairoa head.

LIGHT-VESSEL INSIDE INNER BAR.

A light-vessel is moored on the south edge of the sand flat extending from the Sand spit in 12 feet at low water spring tides, at a distance of about one and a half cables S.W. by S. from the first red beacon.

FOG SIGNAL ON TAIROA HEAD.

In thick or foggy weather a gong will be sounded on Tairoa head every fifteen seconds.

Note.—The leading lights in line S.S.W. lead over the outer bar until the red light at the Pilot station opens out, when the course should be altered for Harrington point; and passing half way between it and the Sand spit, continue a mid-channel course between the buoys on the inner bar; the light-vessel should be left on the starboard hand about 70 yards off
