OTICE is hereby given, that the Government of Western Australia will be ready to enter into an arrangement with some person or firm desirous of taking guano from one of the Lacepede Islands, situated in about 17° 6' S. lat., and 122° 10' E. long., the same being the second Westernmost of the group.

The Government is willing to grant the exclusive right of removing guano from the Island in question for a term of three years, to commence from the 1st day of July, 1877; the licensee to guarantee to take a minimum amount of 40,000 tons during the three years; of which at least 5,000 tons must be taken in the first year and 20,000 tons within the two first years. Tenders to state the royalty per ton to be paid in each year and the nature of the security (to the extent of One thousand pounds) to be given for such payment.
