TO SHIPOWNERS, CAPITALISTS,  
AND OTHERS.

**HIS** Excellency The Governor deems it right to warn all persons who may contemplate engaging directly or indirectly in collecting Guano on the Lacepede and other Islands belonging to this Colony, that the provisions of the Act passed during the last Session of the Legislative Council, intituled "An Act to make further provision for the punishment of persons trespassing on certain portions of the Crown Lands in Western Australia," will be strictly enforced.

That Act makes persons found collecting or removing Guano, without having obtained a license from the proper authority in this Colony, punishable with twelve months' imprisonment with hard labor, in addition to the fine of £100 which they incur under "The Waste Lands Unlawful Occupation Act, 1872;" and further it provides that any ship engaged in this unlawful enterprise shall, together with

her tackle, apparel, furniture, and everything on board her, be seized and condemned as forfeited to the use of Her Majesty.
