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**PROCLAMATION**

WESTERN AUSTRALIA,  
 to wit.

By His Excellency WILLIAM  
 CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON,  
 Esquire, Companion of the

 George, Governor and Com-  
 mander-in-Chief in and over  
 the territory of Western Aus-

**W**HEREAS it is expedient that the limits  
 of the port of Champion Bay, as  
 prescribed by a Proclamation dated the twenty-  
 first day of April, in the year of our Lord One  
 Thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, under  
 the hand of Charles Fitzgerald, the then  
 Governor of the Colony, and under the Public  
 Seal of the Colony, should be altered; Now  
**THEREFORE I**, the said Governor, do hereby  
 declare and proclaim that the said port of  
 Champion Bay shall be deemed and taken to  
 be limited as follows, instead of being limited  
 as in the said Proclamation mentioned, that is  
 to say:—

The said port shall extend from Point Moore  
 on the South to such point on the sea beach on  
 the North as may be cut by a line drawn from  
 Point Moore to the White Peak.

Given under my hand and the Public Seal  
 of the Colony, at Government House,  
 Perth, this twenty-eighth day of De-  
 cember, One Thousand eight hundred  
 and seventy-six.
