CIRCULAR.

Downing Street, 8th November, 1876.

SIR,—I have the honor to transmit to you, for your information and for publication in the Colony under your Government, a copy of an Order of Her Majesty in Council dated the 23rd October, 1876, providing for the apprehension of Deserters from Merchant Ships belonging to the Kingdom of Hawaii, under the "Foreign Deserters Act, 1852."

AT THE COURT AT BALMORAL,

PRESENT,
THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY
IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the "Foreign Deserters Act, 1852," it is provided that whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities are or will be given for recovering or apprehending seamen who desert from British Merchant Ships in the territories of any Foreign power, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council stating that such facilities are or will be given, declare that seamen, not being slaves, who desert from Merchant Ships belonging to such power when within Her Majesty's dominions shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships, and may limit the operation of such Order, and may render the operation thereof subject to such conditions and qualifications, if any, as may be deemed expedient; and whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities are given for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British ships in the territories of His Majesty the King of Hawaii.

NOW, THEREFORE, Her Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Her by the said "Foreign Deserters Act, 1852," and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared that from and after the publication hereof in the "London Gazette," seamen not being slaves, and not being British subjects, who within Her Majesty's dominions desert from Merchant Ships belonging to the Kingdom of Hawaii shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships.

Provided always, that if any such deserter has committed any crime in Her Majesty's dominions he may be detained until he has been tried by a competent Court, and until his sentence (if any) has been fully carried into effect.

And the Secretaries of State for India in Council, the Home Department, and the Colonies are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

NEW ZEALAND.

MIDDLE ISLAND—WEST COAST.

(1) REVOLVING LIGHT ON CAPE FOULWIND.

With reference to Notices to Mariners, No. 20 (2), dated 22nd February, 1876, and No. 99, dated 27th July, 1876, on the intended exhibition of a light from a lighthouse then in the course of erection on Cape Foulwind, west coast of the Middle Island,—

The Colonial Government of New Zealand has given further Notice, that on and after the 1st September, 1876, the light would be exhibited.

The light is a revolving white light, attaining its greatest brilliancy every half minute, elevated 190 feet above the level of high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 19 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the second order.

The lighthouse, 53 feet high, is built of wood, and painted white; the lower part is of open frame work.

NORTH ISLAND—EAST COAST.

(2) AHURIRI ROAD—PORT NAPIER LIGHT.

The following information respecting the limits of the light at the east side of the entrance of Port Napier has been communicated by Commodore A. H. Hoskins, senior officer of H.M. ships; Australia:—

The light is a *fixed* light, showing *red* between the bearings of S.E. by S. and S. by E. $\frac{3}{4}$ E., white from S. by E. $\frac{3}{4}$ E. to S.S.W. $\frac{3}{4}$ W., and *red* from S.S.W. $\frac{3}{4}$ W. to S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ S. The white sector of light is intended to indicate the limits of the anchoring ground.

In clear weather the light should be visible 8 miles.

[The bearings are Magnetic. Variation $14\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$ Easterly in 1876.]
