General Post Office, Perth, January 4th, 1877.

MAILS for transmission by Contract Packet via King George's Sound will close at the General Post Office, Perth, as under:—

For the Australian Colonies, New Zealand, Tasmania, and America, on Monday, the 22nd January, at 12 o'clock (noon).

For Europe, India, Cape of Good Hope, &c., on Saturday, the 27th January, at 2 o'clock, p.m.

Money Orders for transmission by the above conveyances will be issued on the Australian Colonies, New Zealand, and Tasmania, up

to noon on Saturday, the 20th January, and on the United Kingdom up to noon on Friday, 26th January.

Letters for Registration must be posted one hour before the closing of the Mails.

Late Letters, on payment of a fee of 6d., may be posted up to 12h. 30m. for the Colonial Mails, and up to 2h. 30m. for the European Mails.

Newspapers must be posted one hour before the closing of the Mail by which they are intended to be sent, otherwise they will not be forwarded until the next Mail.
