HIS Excellency The Governor has been pleased to direct the publication of the following translation of an Ordinance published by His Excellency The Governor-General of Netherlands India, under date the 14th November, 1876.

IN THE NAME OF THE KING!

THE Governor General of Netherlands India, having heard the Council of Netherlands India;

To all to whom these presents shall come. GREETING.

Announces:

That he, thinking it desirable to alter as follows the Ordinance of 8th February, 1875 (*Government Gazette*, No. 49), in accordance with that of 2nd December, 1875 (*Government Gazette*, No. 274), made applicable to the natives of the Government Celebes and dependencies, bearing in view the Articles 20, 29, 31, 33, and 35, of the regulations for the direction of the Government of Netherlands India, has approved and confirmed that the second paragraph of the Ordinance of 8th February, 1875 (*Government Gazette*, 49), in accordance with that of 2nd December, 1875 (*Government Gazette*, No. 274), made applicable to the natives of the Government Celebes and dependencies, shall be read as follows:—

There must, moreover, be executed a personal or monetary guarantee to the extent of f. 200 (two hundred guilders) for every sailor who is engaged on one of the islands belonging to the Residency of Timor, by an inhabitant of Netherlands India, or by a commercial firm established in Netherlands India, the one or the other, at the discretion of the head of the district.

This guarantee is forfeited if the sailor is not sent back to the chief town Koepang within thirteen months after his engagement, unless in the case of death, which must be legally certified. And in order that no person shall be ignorant of the present, it shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, as far as may be necessary, in the Chinese and Native languages.
