T is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Governor has received a Despatch from Her Majesty's Secretary of State for the Colonies, informing him that Her Majesty will not be advised to exercise her power of disallowance with respect to the following Acts passed by the Legislative Council of Western Australia during the Session of 1876:—

- No. 1.—"An Act to confirm the expenditure for the services of the year One thousand eight hundred and seventy-five beyond the grant for that year."
- No. 2.—"An Act to regulate Prawn fishery."
- No. 3.—"An Act to prohibit the importation to and use within the Colony of Western Australia of certain dangerous matches."
- No. 5.—"An Act to consolidate and amend divers Acts and Ordinances relative to the licensing of Carts and Carriages."
- No. 7.—"An Act to amend and make perpetual 'The Game Act, 1874."
- No. 9.—"An Act to make further provision for the punishment of persons trespassing on certain portions of the Crown Lands in Western Australia."
- No. 11.—"An Act to repeal certain Ordinances relative to Slaughter-houses."
- No. 12.—"An Act to amend 'The District Roads Act, 1871."
- No. 13.—"An Act to amend 'The Municipal Institutions' Act, 1871."
- No. 14.—"An Act to prevent the introduction of contagious or infectious diseases in cattle and sheep."
- No. 15.—"An Act to appropriate the sum of One hundred and Fifty-three thousand Two hundred and Twenty-five pounds Eighteen shillings and Eightpence out of the General Revenue of the Colony for the Service of the year One thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven."

INSTRUCTIONS TO MEASURING SURVEYORS.

#### International Tonnage.

The Board of Trade forward herewith, for the information and guidance of officers concerned in the duties of measurement and registry of ships, a copy of a recently issued Order in Council which extends to vessels of the Kingdom of Italy the advantages held out by the 60th section of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1862."

In consequence of the amount of deduction for propelling power being different in the two countries, option is granted by the enclosed order to the Masters of steam ships of the Kingdom of Italy, whereby the said Masters may elect to have the engine room measured under the rules relating to British ships.

When the engine room is measured according to the British rules in such cases, a "Certificate of British Tonnage" is to be granted adopting thereon the gross tonnage as stated in the Italian Certificate of Registry, and deducting from the gross tonnage the allowance for engine room under the British rules, and also the allowance on account of spaces occupied by seamen or apprentices, and appropriated to their use to their use.

A copy of the document furnished to the Italian master is to be sent to the principal surveyor for tonnage, with a note thereon of the measurement of engine room, and the amount of deduction under the Italian rules.

The fees for admeasurement under the accompanying Order in Council are to be the same as for the admeasurement of British ships for the time being, but only for the spaces actually measured.

ORDER IN COUNCIL REFERRED TO. At the Court at Balmoral, the 30th day of Sept., 1873. PRESENT:

The Queen's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

Whereas by "The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act, 1862," it is enacted, that whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships, for the time being in force under the principal Act, have been adopted by the Government of any foreign country and are in force in that country, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by Order in Council, to direct that the ships of such foreign country shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted

in their certificate of registry or other national papers, and thereupon it shall no longer be necessary for such ships to be re-measured in any port or place in Her Majesty's dominions, but such ships shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificate of registry or other papers in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of British ships is to be deemed the tonnage of such ships:

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships now in force under "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," have been adopted by the Government of His Majesty the King of Italy, and such rules are now in force in that country, having come into operation on the first day of July one thousand eight hundred and seventy-

Her Majesty is hereby pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to direct as follows:—

1. As regards sailing ships—That Merchant sailing ships of the said Kingdom of Italy, the measurement whereof, after the said first day of July one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, has been ascertained and denoted in the registers and other national papers of such sailing ships, testified by the date thereof, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such registers and other national papers denoted in such registers and other national papers in the same manner, and to the same extent, and for the same purpose in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of British sailing ships is deemed to be the tonnage of such ships.

2. As regards steam ships—That merchant ships 2. As regards steam sings—that merchant sings belonging to the said Kingdom of Italy which are propelled by steam or any other power requiring engineroom, the measurement whereof shall, after the said first day of July one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, have been ascertained and denoted in the registers and other national papers of such steam ships, testified by the dates thereof, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such registers or other national papers in the same manner, and to the same extent, and for the same purposes in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of British ships is deemed to be the tonnage of such ships; provided, nevertheless, that if the owner or master of any such Italian steam ship desires the deduction for engine-room in his ships to be estimated under the rules for engine-room measurement and deduction applicable to British ships, instead of under the Italian rule, the engine-room shall be measured, and the deduction calculated according to the British belonging to the said Kingdom of Italy which are prothe deduction calculated according to the British
