Prohibition of Importation of Cattle, Sheep, and Swine, into New Zealand under "The Animals Importation Prohibition Act, 1876."

NORMANBY, Governor.
 ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-seventh day of March, 1877.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the second section of "The Animals Importation and Prohibition Act, 1876," it is, among other things, enacted, that the Governor in

Council may from time to time make, alter, or vary, and may revoke such orders as may seem to be necessary for the purpose of absolutely prohibiting the introduction into New Zealand from any country or colony of all cattle, sheep, or swine: And whereas by an Order in Council dated the fifteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of his Executive Council, ordered and directed that, from and after the fifteenth day of April then next, the introduction into New Zealand of cattle, sheep, or swine from any country or place in the Continent of Europe, including Great Britain and Ireland, should be absolutely prohibited and forbidden, and did also declare that the said Order in Council should remain in force until the expiration of two years from the said fifteenth day of April, unless the said order should in the meantime be revoked: And whereas it appears to the satisfaction of the Governor in Council that disease exists, or is supposed to exist, amongst cattle, sheep, and swine in countries, colonies, and places beyond the limits of the Australasian Colonies, and it is expedient to prohibit the introduction into New Zealand of such animals as hereinafter mentioned:

Now, therefore, His Excellency, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and in exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, and all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby order and direct that from and after the fifteenth day of April next the introduction into New Zealand of cattle, sheep, and swine from any country, colony, or place beyond the limits of the Australasian Colonies shall be, and the same is hereby absolutely prohibited and forbidden; and in further pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by the hereinbefore recited Act, and of all other powers and authorities moving him in that behalf, and with the like advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby prescribe and declare that this Order in Council shall remain in force until the expiration of two years from the fifteenth day of April next, unless in the meantime revoked.

SOUTH-WESTERN PART — FIJI
ISLANDS.

VITI LEVU ISLAND.

The following information relating to Suva harbour, Viti Levu: and to Savu Savu bay, Vanua Levu, is from the reports and surveys of Lieutenants L. S. Dawson and W. U. Moore, H.M.S. *Albatross*, 1876.*

[All Bearings are Magnetic. Variation 9° 40' Easterly in 1876.]

SUVA HARBOUR (Tomba-Ko-Suva), situated on the south-east coast of Viti Levu, just west of Suva point, is about 2 miles long east and west, and from a half to 2 miles broad; the land in the neighbourhood being tolerably high and thickly wooded protects it from the prevailing easterly wind, which however seldom veers to the southward of S.E.; while the reef forming the southern part of the harbour renders the water invariably smooth, and the shores, except immediately northward of the entrance, without surf or break. The entrance is through a clear opening in the reef, 3 cables broad, having in mid-channel 40 to 38 fathoms.

Walou creek, on the east side of the harbour, extends about three quarters of a mile inland, and affords good accommodation for vessels of 5 feet draft.

About the middle of the northern shore of Suva harbour, and nearly abreast of the entrance, a spit (which dries at low water springs) extends nearly 6 cables from a low cliff point, narrowing the harbour at that part to half a mile.

Suva has also in its north-west part an inner harbour (Nai Ngalo Ngalo) which is capable of accommodating several vessels.

DIRECTIONS.—Na Komba Levu, a mountain 1,446 feet high, situated about 3 miles inland, and northward of Suva harbour, bearing N. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. will lead from the offing, and through the entrance in mid-channel, until a large white store-house on the east side of the harbour bears E. by S., which will lead to the anchorage.

There is also a narrow channel inside the reef between Suva harbour and Lauthala bay, about 3 miles to the eastward of it; this channel, if buoyed, would ensure a smooth water communication between the two harbours for small vessels.

TIDES.—It is high water, full and change, in Suva harbour at 6h. 30m.; springs rise $4\frac{1}{2}$ to $5\frac{1}{2}$ feet, neaps 3 to $3\frac{1}{2}$ feet. The hurricane waves that are experienced at Nandi and other parts of the west coast of Viti Levu, do not, according to native report, reach Suva harbour.

VANUA LEVU ISLAND.

SAVU SAVU BAY,† about 10 miles in extent, is situated on the south side of Vanua Levu; the fringe reef on the east side of the entrance extends about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Savu Savu point. Valanga Bay, Saveraka-reka bay, and Na Kama creek, are three anchorages on the east side of Savu Savu bay, all of which have good holding ground (stiff mud), and are protected by the land from the prevailing trade wind.

Valanga bay, the northern anchorage, is nearly three quarters of a mile in extent, having depths of 19 to 10 fathoms; the south-east part of the bay is fringed by a reef, which at the south entrance point extends nearly a quarter of a mile in a north-west direction; in the north-east part of Valanga bay there is a sandy beach about half a mile long, and at 2½ cables to the southward of the north entrance point lies a coral patch nearly awash at low water, with 9 to 16 fathoms close around.

Saveraka-reka, about half a mile to the southward of Valanga bay, is about 3 cables wide north and south, and 3½ deep, having 15 fathoms in the entrance, and 5 to 6 fathoms within half a cable of the shore reef.

The fringe reef extends about one cable from the northern shore of this bay, and one to 2 cables from the eastern; the south side is formed by the coral reef which dries at low water, and extends $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles S.W. by W., where it encircles Navi island, north side of Na Kama creek entrance.

Na Kama creek, the southern anchorage in Savu Savu bay, is about half a mile long E. by N. and W. by S., with an average breadth of 150 yards, having depths of 14 to 6 fathoms in the middle.

On the south shore of Na Kama creek, and 200 yards from the beach, there are some boiling springs, generally in active operation, and form a considerable stream flowing into the creek at Moniseva.

Between Moniseva, and Daku one mile to the westward of it, hot springs occur along the beach at several places.

Water.—Good water can be obtained in Valanga bay, Na Kama creek, and at Daku.

Earthquakes.—Slight shocks of earthquakes are experienced occasionally during the hot season, and not unfrequently precede a gale.

Caution.—When the trade wind is fresh, sailing in boats is dangerous, on account of the heavy squalls which sweep off the land across the bay.

TIDES.—It is high water, full and change, in Valanga bay, at 5h. 55m.; springs rise $5\frac{1}{2}$ feet, neaps $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet.

DIRECTION ISLAND REEF.

Directions from Savu Savu bay to the westward.—Small sailing vessels gain time by passing through a break in the Direction Island reef, abreast Direction island. Steer when approaching the long reef, with right extreme of Direction island just open of the left extreme of Makongai island, pass within a few yards of Direction island, and take the most westerly of three breaks in the western side of the barrier. This course will, if the prevailing trade wind be blowing, save a tack to weather the south point of Direction Island reef.

AUSTRALIA—SOUTH COAST.

INVESTIGATOR STRAIT.

(1) SUNKEN ROCK OFF THE SOUTH-WEST POINT OF
YORK PENINSULA.

The Colonial Government of South Australia has given Notice, that the Commander of the steam vessel *Governor Musgrave* has reported the existence of heavy breakers about 2½ miles off the south-west point of York peninsula, bearing W. by N., distant about one mile from Emmes reef. At the time the breakers were seen, a moderate south-west gale was blowing with a high sea.

This bearing and distance places the danger in lat. 35° 18' 40" S., long. 136° 47' 30" E.

VICTORIA.

(2) ALTERATION IN POSITION OF JETTY LIGHT,
PORT FAIRY.

The Colonial Government of Victoria has given Notice, that the lighthouse formerly on the jetty at port Fairy has been moved S.W. by W., 500 yards, to a position on Look-out hill.

The light is a fixed *green* light, and in clear weather should be seen between the bearings of South and W.S.W. from a distance of about 3 miles.

NOTE.—Approaching from seaward, the green light may be steered for as soon as seen, and anchorage taken up as convenient. Small vessels will find the best anchorage in about 3 fathoms water, one cable north-west of Foul bank buoy.

TASMANIA.

(3) ALTERATIONS IN HARBOR LIGHTS AT HOBART TOWN.

The Colonial Government of Tasmania has given Notice of the following alterations in harbor lights at Hobart town.

1. Argyle street wharf:—*red* light exhibited.
2. Dunn street wharf:—*red* light discontinued.
3. Franklin wharf (behind Kangaroo slip):—*green* light exhibited.
4. Castray esplanade:—the principal light has been replaced by an ordinary light.
