# PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency WILLIAM Western Australia, CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, Esquire, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over WILLIAM C. F. ROBINSON. the territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c,

HEREAS the Legislative Council of this Colony stands prorogued to the twenty-sixth day of May, instant, and whereas by divers Acts of the Imperial Legislature it is made lawful for the Governor of the Colony of Western Australia for the time being to fix such place within any part of the said Colony, and such time for holding every Session of the said Legislative Council of the said Colony, as he may think fit; Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, as aforesaid, do hereby, in exercise of the powers in me vested, further prorogue the said Legislative Council to Tuesday, the tenth day of July, next ensuing, THEN TO MEET FOR THE DESPATCH OF BUSINESS, in the Legislative Council Chamber, in the City of Perth, at the hour of three o'clock in the afternoon; and the Members of the said Legislative Council are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

DVERTING to the Rules and Regulations for the Colonial Medical Service, approved by His Excellency the Governor on the 6th November, 1872, His Excellency has been pleased to direct the addition of the following interpretation Clause to Sec. 21 of the Rules and Regulations as aforesaid:-

The word "family" is to be understood to mean those persons who constitute a man's ordinary household and live under his roof and at his expense, other than able-bodied sons of over 21 years of age. Sons and daughters who may be domiciled with their fathers for the sake of convenience, but who have sufficient means of subsistence, separate from that which the father obtains from his Government appointment, are not included in the word family.
