HEREAS the Legislative Council of this Colony stands prorogued to the twenty-sixth day of May, instant, and whereas by divers Acts of the Imperial Legislature it is made lawful for the Governor of the Colony of Western Australia for the time being to fix such place within any part of the said Colony, and such time for holding every Session of the said Legislative Council of the said Colony, as he may think fit; Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, as aforesaid, do hereby, in exercise of the powers in me vested, further prorogue the said Legislative Council to Tuesday, the tenth day of July, next ensuing, Then to MEET FOR THE DESPATCH OF BUSINESS, in the Legislative Council Chamber, in the City of Perth, at the hour of three o'clock in the afternoon; and the MEMBERS of the said Legislative Council are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.
