WHEREAS the Legislative Council of this Colony stands prorogued to the twenty-sixth day of May, instant, and whereas by divers Acts of the Imperial Legislature it is made lawful for the Governor of the Colony of Western Australia for the time being to fix such place within any part of the said Colony, and such time for holding every Session of the said Legislative Council of the said Colony, as he may think fit; Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, as aforesaid, do hereby, in exercise of the powers in me vested, further prorogue the said Legislative Council to Tuesday, the tenth day of July, next ensuing, THEN TO MEET FOR THE DESPATCH OF BUSINESS, in the Legislative Council Chamber, in the City of Perth, at the hour of three o'clock in the afternoon; and the MEMBERS of the said Legislative Council are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

AUSTRALIA—WEST COAST.

(1) LEADING LIGHTS AT CHAMPION BAY.

The Government of Western Australia has given Notice, that two leading lights are now exhibited from lighthouses erected at the north part of Champion Bay (near high water mark), about one mile southward of Chapman River; and half a mile northward of Cutting Beacon.

The lights are fixed red lights, elevated 65 and 41 feet respectively above the level of the sea, and should be visible in clear weather, through an arc of 75°, from a distance of 8 or 9 miles.

The towers painted white, with keeper's dwelling attached, are 302 yards apart, and bear from each other E. by N. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. and W. by S. $\frac{1}{4}$ S.

The upper tower, 25 feet high, is square; the lower tower, 37 feet high, is octagonal.

The illuminating apparatus of the lower light is of the fourth order.

NOTE.—These lights in line (bearing E. by N. $\frac{1}{2}$ N.) lead between the shoals that extend northward of Point Moore and the shoal ground southward of Four-fathom bank.

Position of lower light, lat. 28° 44' 35" S., long. 114° 37' 25" E.

NEW ZEALAND.

MIDDLE ISLAND—EAST COAST.

(2) HARBOR LIGHT AT OAMARU.

The Government of New Zealand has given notice, that from 1st December, 1876, a harbour light would be exhibited from a staff at the north end of the breakwater, Oamaru anchorage.

The light is a fixed red light, elevated 16 feet above the level of the sea, and should be visible in clear weather, between the bearings of N.W. and S.S.W., from a distance of 3 or 4 miles.

NOTE.—During bad weather, when the danger lights (two white lights horizontal with a red light between them) are shown from the flagstaff; the red light at the breakwater will not be exhibited.

[All bearings are magnetic.
