PORT REGULATIONS.

*Colonial Secretary's Office,

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that under the provisions contained in the "Shipping and Pilotage Consolidation Ordinance, 1855," His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to cancel Rule No. 10 (*applicable to the Port of Fremantle only*) and to direct that the following Rule be substituted in place thereof, viz:—

"No. 10.—No boats except steam boats shall be allowed to cross the Bar at the mouth of the River Swan at Fremantle, whenever a Ball is hoisted at the Yard Arm of the Flag Staff on Arthur's Head; and the master of any steam boat will only be allowed to cross on the understanding that it is entirely at his own risk and responsibility.

"Steamers in such cases will not be allowed to tow other vessels across or to carry passengers."
