CLAUSE 153.—"Whenever any person in this "Country shall be appointed to any office, the salary "and fees (if any) attached to which do not exceed "and fees (if any) attached to which do not exceed "£500 per annum, in a colony not possessing a "Representative Assembly, the Crown Agents for "the Colonies will secure and pay for his passage "to the Colony, also those of his wife and children, "not exceeding four persons besides himself. The "person so appointed will be required to execute an "'Agreement' in the form inserted in the Appendix "(page 122)."

SIR,—I have the honor to forward, herewith, copy of "an Act to regulate the Immigration of Chinese, "and to make provision against their becoming a "charge upon the Colony," which has lately come into operation here.

Six copies of a short precis of this Act are also herewith enclosed, and I hope that you will kindly give such publicity as you conveniently can to this information, as it is desirable that shippers and other persons concerned in the Chinese passenger trade should be acquainted with the conditions applied to it by this Government.

Summary of the Principal Provisions of an Act of the Legis-lature of Queensland, intituled "The Chinese Immigrants Regulation Act of 1877."

Clause 2 provides that the master of every vessel having Chinese on board shall, immediately on arrival and before entry at the Customs, deliver to the Collector, or other principal officer of Customs, a list of Chinese passengers on board. Penalty for default not exceeding two hundred pounds.

Penalty for default not exceeding two hundred pounds.

Clause 3 provides that, if any vessel shall arrive in any port in Queensland having on board a greater number of Chinese passengers than in the proportion of one to every ten tons of the tonnage of such vessel, according to the registry thereof if British, and if not, then according to the measurement defined by "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1834," the owner, charterer, or master of such vessel shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds for each Chinese passenger so carried in excess.

Clause 4 provides that, before making entry at the Customs, the master of the vessel shall pay to the Collector, or other principal officer, ten pounds for every Chinese passenger about to be landed. Penalty for neglecting this provision not exceeding twenty pounds per head, in addition to the said sum of ten pounds, together with forfeiture and condemnation of vessel.

Clause 5 provides that every Chinese arriving otherwise than by sea, shall pay a sum of ten pounds.

Clause 6 provides that the officer receiving this amount of ten pounds shall, without demand, forthwith hand to the Chinese immigrant a certificate of the payment of such sum.

Clause 7 provides that any Chinese immigrant leaving the Colony within three years after such payment, on producing to the Collector, or other principal officer of Customs at the port of departure, the certificate handed to him on his arrival, shall have proved to the satisfaction of the Colonial Treasurer that, during his residence in the colony, he has not, as an immate of any hospital or gaol, been any charge on the revenue thereof.

Clause 8 provides that any Chinese entering or attempting to enter the colony, over the Border, without payment of ten pounds, shall, besides such sum, be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

Clause 10 provides that the Colonial Treasurer, or officer authorised by him, may grant to any Chinese, being a bond fide resident of the colony at the time of passing this Act, an exemption for a temporary absence only, and for a specified time.

Clause 11 provides that no Chinese, who is one of the crew of any vessel, shall be liable to make such payment unless he lands.

REVOLVING LIGHT ON TIPARA REEF.

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 63, dated 24th May, 1877, on the intended alteration in Tipara reef light:—

The Government of South Australia has given further Notice, that on and after the 20th August, 1877, a light will be exhibited from an iron screw pile lighthouse recently erected on Tipara reef:—

The light will be a revolving white light of the first order, attaining its greatest brilliancy every thirty seconds, elevated 100 feet above high water, and in clear weather should be visible from a distance of 16 miles.

NORTHUMBERLAND ISLANDS.

The following information has been received from Lieut. Connor, R.N., the Assistant Admiralty Surveyor:—

Edwards' Shoal is a narrow sand-bank, steep to, upon which the sea breaks occasionally. It lies in the following position, viz.:—

North end 2.6 miles N.E. by N. } from the summit of Ridge South end $1\frac{1}{8}$ miles N.E. by E. $\frac{3}{4}$ E. } Island.

At about the middle of the shoal there is at low water springs a depth of about 7 feet, with 9 feet on either side for a distance of a of a mile.

YARALLA SHOAL is a long narrow shoal of fine sand, steep to. North end 6.5 miles N. $\frac{1}{4}$ W.) from summit of Ridge South end 4.1 miles N. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. Island.

It has 11 feet on its shoalest part, which lies 4 cables from its northern extremity.

The summit of Constance Islet (100 feet high) kept just open of Granite Island—which is shown on the chart as being 465 feet high—bearing N. \(\frac{1}{2} \) W., leads in mid-channel between the Yaralla and Pearl Shoals.

ANOTHER SHOAL, on the south end of which there is a depth of 15 feet, lies N. \(\) W., \(\)\(\) miles from the summit of Ridge Island. The position of its northern extremity and the least water upon it have not yet been determined.

PEARL SHOAL, which is of sand, narrow and steep to, extends 2.5 miles S.W. & S. from Wallace Islet. Its shoalest part, upon which there is only 3 feet of water, is at a distance of 1.3 miles from the shore.

ROCKET SPIT, of sand and steep to, with a depth of from 12 to 15 feet over it, extends to the south-westward from h. 1. Islet, from the summit of which its extremity lies S.W. by W., 1½ miles. With the flood tide there is a heavy rip over the spit.

Unless thoroughly acquainted with the navigation, vessels of heavy draught are recommended not to pass to the westward of the Beverley Group.

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, PORT DARWIN, AND LONDON TELEGRAPH. CONDITIONS.

The following are the conditions under which messages will be transmitted on and after January 1st, 1876:-

- 1. The length of a word is limited to a maximum of ten letters.
- 2. Only ordinary dictionary words should be used. Artificially-constructed words are subject to the cipher rate.
- 3. Groups of figures may be transmitted, and will be charged at the rate of five to the word, if expressing ordinary commercial quotations; but if used for code purposes they will be subject to the cipher rate.
 - 4. Groups of letters or artificially-constructed words will be treated in the same manner as figures.
- 5. Cipher telegrams must be collated—i.e., repeated back in their entirety from station to station. Half rate extra is charged for collating.
- 6. Any combination of code employing in the same message groups of figures and letters is strictly prohibited, and telegrams composed in this manner cannot be accepted.
- 7. Addresses may be written in code, at the sender's risk, under arrangement with the administrations concerned. The signature may also be a code word, or the last word of the message may replace it.
- 8. The following abbreviated forms for expressing "Reply paid," "Acknowledgment of receipt," "Collating," and "Telegram to follow" have been agreed to, so that only one word need be paid for to convey these instructions:—
