Vaccination Act, 1878.

Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth, 7th January, 1879.

N accordance with the provisions of the 42nd Victoria, No. 13, Clause 5, the Urban Districts for the purposes of "The Vaccination Act, 1878," are declared by the Governor in Council to be within a radius of five miles, and the Suburban Districts within a radius of twenty miles, from the places of residence of the Public Vaccinators appointed by notice in the Government Gazette of this date.

The said districts are shown on a map lodged in the office of the Colonial Secretary, a copy of which can also be seen at the residence of each Public Vaccinator.

It will be observed that where the radii intersect, the boundary is a straight line drawn between the points of intersection, and that the Suburban Districts of Perth, Fremantle, and Guildford are defined by a single boundary line colored green.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, of the second order, showing two flashes in succession, at an interval of one minute, followed by two minutes of fixed light, the series of changes occupying four minutes.

The light, which shows all round the horizon, is 72 feet above high water, and is visible from the deck of a small craft about 13 miles.
