Sir,—I have the honor to transmit to you, for information and publication in the Colony under your Government, a copy of an Order of the Queen in Council of the 30th December last, under the Merchant Shipping Acts, modifying a previous Order in Council of the 29th February, 1868, exempting from representation in this country Danish ing from re-measurement in this country Danish Vessels, the Certificates of Danish Nationality and Registry of which are dated on and after the 1st of October, 1867.

It appears that the Board of Trade did not furnish this Department, as in the present instance, with a copy of the Order in Council of the 29th February, 1868, for transmission to the various Colonial Governments, I therefore enclose copies of that Order, which (if not already published in the Colony) should be published at the same time as the amending Order.
