"I'HE following General Regulation for the management and use of all Public Jetties at the several Ports of the Colony (excepting Albany and Fremantle) which was framed by the Governor in Council on the 21st day of April last, in accordance with the provisions of the 42nd Vic. No. 18 ("The Jetties Regulations Act, 1878"), is published for general information:—

1. Jetty dues as mentioned in No. 22 of the General Regulations for the management and use of all Public Jetties at the several ports of the Colony of Western Australia, published in the Government Gazette of the 24th December, 1878, shall, so far as regards grain, flour, and hay, be paid only on one voyage at the Jetties in the hands of the Crown.

This Regulation shall not affect the right of a Municipality, or of a person who shall have rented or farmed a Jetty from the Crown, to charge Jetty dues notwithstanding such grain, flour, and hay shall have been shipped or landed from or at a Jetty in the hands of the Crown.
