IS Excellency the Governor directs the publication of the following Proclamation for general information.

By His Excellency's Command. ROGER TUCKFD. GOLDSWORTHY, Colonial Secretary.

NEW SOUTH WALES, to wit.

| The Right Honorable Lord Augustus WILLIAM FREDERICK SPENCER LOFTUS, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of New South Wales and its Dependencies.

HEREAS by a Proclamation dated the 17th day of March, 1876, issued under the 10th section of the Act of Parliament of New South Wales, passed in the thirty-fifth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled the "Imported Stock Act of 1871," and numbered six: the importa-tion or introduction into this colony of stock, fodder, or fittings from any colony or country other than the colonies of Victoria, South Australia, Queensland, Tasmania, and Western Australia, is restricted and absolutely prohibited for the further period from the 30th day of June, 1876, to the 30th day of June, 1878. And whereas by Proclamation dated the 3rd day of July, 1878, the prohibition hereinbefore mentioned was continued against the importation of stock from any colony or country other than from the colonies aforesaid, and from the countries of Great Britain, Ireland, Canada, and the United States of America, from which last mentioned countries and colony cattle and sheep were admitted into this colony, subject to the regulations mentioned in the said Proclamation: And whereas it is considered expedient to allow stock coming to this colony from colonies and countries other than the colonies aforesaid and Great Britain, Ireland, Canada, and the United States of America, for the purpose of being exhibited at the International Exhibition, now holden at Sydney,—to be imported into this colony under proper precautions: Now therefore I, The Right Honorable Lord Augustus William Frederick Spencer Loftus, the Governor aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Preclemation declare that the prachibition herein Proclamation declare that the prohibition herein-before mentioned is hereby withdrawn with regard to such stock, and that they may be imported or introduced into this colony, for the purpose of the aforesaid Exhibition, subject to all the regulations contained in the said Proclamation of 3rd July, 1878, contained in the said Proclamation of 3rd July, 1878, except that any such stock may after a period of not less than thirty days from the date of their going into Quarantine, be removed to, and remain in that proclaimed hereunder at the Exhibition aforesaid, while the show of that particular description of stock lasts, and shall afterwards be returned to the Quarantine to which they were originally taken when landed, and there remain until the full period of ninety days shall have expired.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Government House, Sydney, this nineteenth day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, and in the forty-third year of Her Majesty's Reign.

THE attention of the public is drawn to the provision contained in number 64 of the Land Regulations:-

"The Commissioner of Crown Lands is author-"ised to insert in any lease or license, a clause permitting the lessee or licensee to cut such "timber, on any Crown Lands, as may be re-

"quired for domestic uses, for the construction "or repair of buildings, fences, stockyards, or "other improvements on the land so occupied, "but not for any other purpose."

Such person or persons as desire this privilege must send in, either direct or through the Resident Magistrate of their District, the lease or license, as the case may be, accompanied by a request in writing that the requisite endorsement may be made, for which there will be no charge.

For the future, when an applicant requires the right to cut timber, it should be noted on the face of the application before it is deposited in this Office.

Fresh Meat to be delivered daily, when the Government or its representative may consider it practicable, and in proportion of three days' supply of Mutton to four days' supply of Beef per week, or alternate days of each. When Beef is issued, fore and hind quarters, or portions thereof, are to be delivered alternately; six inches at least to be cut off the hough and neck bones. Mutton to be delivered in carcasses, excluding heads, necks, shanks below the knee, and hough joints.

The supplies to be delivered at such places and times as may be required by the Government or persons deputed by it.

The ordinary ration of Vegetables to consist of 1lb. of Potatoes; but when demanded by the Government, and in season, the following equivalents must be supplied twice a week: Pumpkins, 2lbs.; or Turnips, Carrots, or Cabbage, 1½lbs.; or Onions, ¼lb., for every pound of Potatoes.

All supplies must be delivered in good and sound packages; Corn and Flour sacks, and Oil casks, will be returned to the Contractors; other packages will be retained free of charge.

The Contractors will be liable for any expense which may be incurred by the Government in consequence of the non-performance of their contracts.

Payments to be made monthly, and for general supplies for the quantities actually consumed in the month.

No transfer of any Contract will be permitted, without the previous consent of the Government.

Each Tender must bear the bona fide signatures of two responsible and approved sureties, who will be required to be bound for the due performance of the Contract, under a penalty of about one-fourth of the estimated sum to be paid under each Contract. Parties are requested to be careful in drawing up their Tenders, which should be in strict conformity with this Notice.

- 5.—All exhibits must be on the Show Ground by 9 a.m., or they will not be allowed to compete.

- 7.—The Judges will withhold prizes from such exhibits as they may deem unworthy.
