ITH reference to the practice of Government Officers and others, while travelling, obtaining Forage on payment at different Police Stations in the Colony, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to direct, that from the 1st January next the following system shall come into force:—

Government Officers and others travelling, and provided with an order from the Superin-

tendent of Police, will be permitted to obtain Forage at the different Police Stations in the Colony, but in lieu of paying for it at the time, they will give the Constable in charge of the Station a receipt for the amount of Forage received, on a printed Form contained in a book which will be kept specially for the purpose at each Police Station.

All persons other than Government Officers travelling on duty will have, in addition, to give on the face of such receipt an order on some person in Perth for the payment of the money due.

Except to Government Officers travelling on duty, no permission will be given to any persons to receive Forage at any Stations where there is a Licensed Inn.
