GEORGE ORD, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commanderin-Chief in and over the territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS by the fifth section of the ↓ 14th Victoria, No. 6, of 1850, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of his Executive Council, to appoint, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, any place or places of confinement on the mainland for the reception and detention of convicts at hard labour during the terms or unexpired residue of the terms of their respective sentences or orders of transportation; Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and by virtue and in exercise of the powers in me vested as aforesaid, do by this my Proclamation appoint the Depôt at the Blue Stone Quarry on the York road, and situate about four miles from Guildford, as a place of confinement for the reception and detention of convicts at hard labour during the terms or unexpired residue of the terms of their respective sentences or orders of transportation.
