HEREAS by a Deed Poll of Grant bearing date the twenty-fifth day of July, 1858, under the hand of the Governor and the Public Seal of the Colony, the Victoria Location No. 317 was granted to E. Hamersley & Co., and whereas by the said Deed Poll power was reserved to the Crown to resume and enter upon possession of any part of the said land which it might at any time by the Crown be deemed necessary to resume for making roads, canals, bridges, towing paths, or other works of public utility or convenience: and whereas the piece or parcel of Land hereinafter described is necessary for the purpose of making a Public Road, and the said piece or parcel of land has been resumed accordingly; Now know YE that Her Most Gracious Majesty doth hereby and by virtue of the said power and authority reserved and contained in the said recited Deed Poll resume, for the purposes aforesaid, all that piece or parcel of land in the Victoria District containing about two acres, more or less, and being such part of Location 317 as is bounded on the *South* by a line extending East-

ward from the North-east angle of Dongara

Town Lot 23 (reserved for school purposes), to

the Public Road; bounded on the West by Police Reserve, Town Lot No. 21, and Church

of England Reserve, Town Lot No. 1; bounded on the Northward by a line North-east from South-east corner of Location 539 to the present Public Road; and bounded on the Eastward by a line one chain more or less distant, as shown on the authenticated plan in the office of the Surveyor General, Perth. The Old Road containing about 1 acre, 1 rood, 0 perches, so far as superseded by the New Line, is abandoned.

THE following boundaries defining the Blackwood Magisterial District are published for general information, viz.:-

#### BLACKWOOD MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT.

Bounded on the Northward by lines extending Eastward from the South-west corner of Wellington Eastward from the South-west corner of Wellington Location 171 to a point due South from the South-east corner of Wellington Location 40; thence North passing along the Eastern boundary of said Location 40 to "Gregory's marked line" of road from Bunbury to Kojonup, and thence by the Kojonup or Old Post Road to the junction of the Balgarrup and Blackwood Rivers. On the Westward by a South-easterly line from the South-west corner of Wellington Location 171 to the junction of Padbury's Brook with the Blackwood River, and from thence to Manjinnup. On the Southweard by an East-south-easterly line On the Southward by an East-south-easterly line from Manjinnup to Perup, and from thence by a due East line; and on the Bastward by a South-easterly line from the Junction of the Balgarrup and Blackwood Rivers in the direction of the North shore of Lake Matilda until it intersects the South boundary.

(42 & 43 Vict.) Confirmation of Marriages on HER MAJESTY'S SHIPS ACT, 1879.

#### Chapter 29.

An Act to remove doubts as to the validity of certain marriages of British subjects on board Her Majesty's Ships.

Whereas Officers commanding Her Majesty's Ships on foreign stations have permitted marriages to be solemnized according to religious rites or ceremonies, or to be contracted per verba de presenti in the presence of such officers, in the belief that marriages were authorized by law to be so solemnized and contracted, and doubts have arisen with respect to the validity of such marriages, and it is expedient to confirm the same:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and con-sent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

Short Title, Confirmation of Marriages of British Subjects solemnized on board Her Majesty's Ships.

1. This Act may be cited as the Confirmation of Marriages on Her Majesty's Ships Act, 1879.

2. All marriages, both of the parties being British 2. All marriages, both of the parties being British subjects, which before the passing of this Act have been solemnized on board one of Her Majesty's vessels on a foreign station in the presence of the officer commanding such vessel, whether solemnized according to any religious rite or ceremony, or contracted per verba de presenti, shall be valid in like manner as if the same had been solemnized within Har Majesty's dominions with the due observance of Her Majesty's dominions with the due observance of all forms required by law.

Provided that this enactment shall not render Provided that this enactment shall not render valid any marriage which before the passing of this Act has been declared invalid by any Court of competent jurisdiction in any proceeding touching such marriage, or any right dependent on the validity or invalidity thereof, or render valid any marriage where either of the parties has before the passing of this Act, and during the life of the other party lawfully intermediate with any power. fully intermarried with any person.

TREATY OF FRIENDSHIP, BETWEEN HER MAJESTY THE QUEEN OF GREAT BRITAIN AND IRELAND AND THE KING OF TONGA.

THE KING OF TONGA.

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and His Majesty the King of Tonga, being desirous to maintain and strengthen the relations of friendship which happily subsist between their respective dominions and subjects, have resolved to conclude a treaty for that purpose, and have therefore named as their Plenipotentiaries:

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, &c., &c., &c.

The Honorable Sir Arthur Hamilton Gordon, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Her Britannic Majesty's High Commissioner and Consul-General for the Western Pacific, Governor of Fiji; and Alfred Percival Maudslay, Esquire, one of Her Majesty's Deputy Commissioners for the Western Pacific; and His Majesty the King of Tonga, &c.:

His Majesty the King of Tonga, &c.: Wellington Tubou Malohi, Knight of the Order of the Red Eagle of the second class, Governor of Vavou; and

George Fatafeki, Governor of Haapai;
Who after having communicated to each other their respective full powers, have agreed upon and concluded the following Articles:—

#### ARTICLE I.

There shall be perpetual peace and friendship between Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Her heirs and successors, and His Majesty the King of Tonga, his heirs and successors, and between their respective dominions and subjects.

#### ARTICLE II.

ARTICLE II.

His Majesty the King of Tonga engages to grant to no other Sovereign or State any rights, powers, authority or privileges in Tonga in excess of those accorded to Her Britannic Majesty. The subjects of Her Britannic Majesty shall always enjoy in Tonga whatever rights, privileges and immunities they now possess, or which are now accorded to the subjects of the most favoured nation; and the like privileges shall be equally enjoyed by Tongan subjects in the territories of Her Britannic Majesty; and no rights, privileges, or immunities shall be granted hereafter in Tonga to the subjects of any Foreign State which shall not equally and unconditionally be granted to the subjects of Her Britannic Majesty.

#### ARTICLE III.

- (a.) If any subject of Her Britannic Majesty in Tonga is charged with a criminal offence cognizable by British law, such charge may be tried by Her Britannic Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific Islands, or other British officer duly authorised by Her Britannic Majesty in that behalf.

  (b.) If any subject of Her Britannic Majesty in Tonga is charged with an offence against the Municipal Law of Tonga not cognizable as such under British law, he shall be amenable to the jurisdiction of the Tongan Courts, the proceedings of which shall be conducted in public, and the records of which shall be conducted in public, and the records of which shall be public and accessible.

  (c.) If any subject of Her Britannic Majesty in Tonga is charged with a criminal offence cognizable as such both by British law and the laws of Tonga, the party charged may elect whether he will be tried by a Tongan Court, or by the Court of Her Britannic Majesty's High Commissioner.

  (d.) Any civil suit which may be brought in Tonga against
- (d.) Any civil suit which may be brought in Tonga against any subject of Her Britannic Majesty in Tonga, shall be brought before and shall be tried by the Court of Her Britannic Majesty's High Commissioner:
- High Commissioner:

  (e.) Every summons or warrant to appear as a witness before the Court of Her Britannic Majesty's High Commissioner, issued in accordance with British law, and directed to a Tongan subject, shall, if possible, be endorsed by a judge of the Supreme Court of Tonga and, when so endorsed by a judge of the Supreme Court of Tonga and, when so endorsed, shall have the same authority, and may be enforced in like manner as if issued by the Supreme Court of Tonga, but where it shall be made to appear to the Court that the delay required to procure such endorsement might lead to the escape or removal of a material witness, such summons or warrant may be issued by the Court without such endorsement, and shall have the same authority, and may be enforced in like manner as if such summons or warrant had been directed to a subject of Her Britannic Majesty.
- (f.) The expression "British law" in this Article includes any regulations duly made and issued by Her Britannic Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific Islands for the better government of British subjects within his jurisdiction.

#### ARTICLE IV.

ARTICLE IV.

Her Britannic Majesty agrees to surrender to his Majesty the King of Tonga any Tongan subject who, being accused or convicted of any of the undermentioned crimes, committed in the territory of the King of Tonga, shall be found within the territory of Her Britannic Majesty.

The crimes for which such surrender may be granted are the following:

Murder or attempt to murder: Embezzlement or larceny:
Fraudulent Bankruptcy: Forgery.

#### ARTICLE V.

The present Treaty shall come into force and effect from the date of the signatures thereof, but shall again become null and void if not ratified within the prescribed period.

#### ARTICLE VI.

The present Treaty shall be ratified and the ratifications exchanged at Nukualofa within twelve months from the date thereof.

In witness whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the same and have affixed thereto their seals.

Done at Nukualofa the twenty-ninth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.
