#### General Order, No. 17.

N relinquishing the Government of the Colony which he has administered for nearly two and a half years, His Excellency Major-General Sir Harry St. George Ord desires to record his sense of the efficient manner in which the duties of the various Public Departments of the Colony have been conducted during that period.

This is mainly attributable to the care and attention bestowed on their duties by the Heads of the different Departments, seconded as they have been by the willing co-operation of their Subordinate Officers, and His Excellency desires to tender his sincere thanks to the Honorable the Colonial Secretary, the Acting Attorney General, the Surveyor General, the late Acting Treasurer, and the Director of Public Works, for the valuable assistance they have given him in maintaining the efficiency of the Public Service.

The Governor's thanks are also due to the Government Residents, the Resident Magistrates, the Auditor General, the Postmaster General, the Collector of Customs, the Commissioner of Titles, the Principal Medical Officer, the Sheriff, and the Harbor Master, and the Governor gratefully acknowledges the faithful manner in which the Public Officers of the Colony have discharged the duties of their several Offices.

The difficult duty of maintaining public order has been well carried out by the Police, acting under the orders of the Superintendent, and District Inspectors, and the conduct of the Non-commissioned Officers and Constables of the Force, both land and water, has been such as to merit His Excellency's approbation.

To the late Inspector of Volunteers, the Staff Officers, and Captains of Companies, very great credit is due for the highly satisfactory condition to which the Force has been brought, and His Excellency's thanks are due to them, the Subaltern Officers, Non-commissioned Officers, and Privates for the zealous and effective manner in which they have discharged their duties.

From the Honorable the Commandant the Governor has ever received the greatest assistance, both in his position as a Member of the Executive Council, and as Commanding the Troops in the Colony, and His Excellency cannot omit to acknowledge the orderly conduct and good behaviour of the Non-commissioned Officers and men of the Pensioner Force, to whom and Lieutenant-Colonel Finnerty he begs to tender his thanks.

IS Excellency the Governor having had submitted to him the following Regulations for the management of Bridgetown Commonage, has been pleased to allow of their adoption.

MALCOLM FRASER, Commissioner of Crown Lands.

AT a public meeting held at the Mechanics' Institute, Bridgetown, on the 12th day of February, 1880, for the purpose of promulgating Rules and Regulations for Bridgetown Commonage, the following were proposed:—

- 1. No person to depasture stock on Commonage without license.
- 2. License to be issued by Chairman of Commonage Board.
- 3. Cattle above twelve months, not exceeding ten head, 2s. 6d. per head; under twelve months old, 1s. 3d. per head.
- 4. Cattle above ten head in number, over twelve months old, 5s. per head; under twelve months old, 2s. 6d. per head.
- 5. The same Rules and Regulations for cattle to apply to horses.

- 6. Sheep depasturing on the Commonage, for the purpose of being killed for use in the town, to be kept on south side of river, not to exceed 100 in number, to be charged threepence a head.
- 7. No stock to be kept on the Commonage unless the property of persons residing within it.
- 8. All sheep travelling not to stay on Commonage more than one night, without permission from Chairman.
- 9. Fees collected to be expended in improving the town by the body having the management.
- 10. Stray cattle or sheep from adjoining runs to be allowed to occupy the Commonage without paying any fees, if shown to be accidentally upon it, and if steps are taken at once for their removal.

IS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR has been pleased to direct that General Orders Nos. 5 and 8 be cancelled, and that from and after the 31st instant, Witnesses duly summoned and attending to give evidence at any Criminal Session of the Supreme Court, before any Court of Quarter or General Sessions of the Peace, or before Justices in Petty Sessions, or on any Inquest, shall be paid only on the following scale:—

Officers in the service of the Government, whose whole time is at the disposal of the Government, will not be entitled to remuneration for "loss of time," but they will be reimbursed their actual expenses according to their position in the Government Service, comparatively with persons in the above Scale.

In computing the compensation to be paid for loss of time, Witnesses summoned from a distance of fifteen miles or more, shall be entitled to receive one day's allowance for every fifteen miles (one way) that they may have to travel, beyond the allowance for every day that they may be in attendance at the Court. Witnesses summoned from a distance of less than fifteen miles, shall receive an allowance only for the day or days that they may be in attendance at the Court.

For travelling expenses, Witnesses shall be paid at the rate of eight pence per mile one way.

Jurors attending on Inquests shall be paid at the rate of five shillings a day for each day of attendance, and the sum of eight pence per mile of distance between their respective places of residence and the place where the Inquest is held.
