WESTERN AUSTRALIA, No. 13.

Downing Street, 26th February, 1880.

SIR,—I have the honor to inform you that Her Majesty will not be advised to exercise her power of disallowance with respect to the following Acts of the Legislature of Western Australia, transcripts of which accompanied Sir H. Ord's Despatch No. 146, of the 25th of November last:—

- No. 2.—"An Act to prohibit the use of Dynamite or other explosive substances for the purpose of catching or destroying Fish in Western Australia."
